Bill Summary

The state personnel director (director) is currently authorized to establish and operate an employee assistance program intended to address personal problems and workplace issues faced by state employees and employers. Current law states that the dependents of a state employee are not eligible to participate in any employee assistance program established

and operated by the director. The bill clarifies that the dependant of a state employee is not eligible to be the sole and direct recipient of services from an employee assistance program, but that the program may allow the participation of a state employee's dependant or any other person who is not a state employee in an employee assistance program if such participation is necessary to provide effective counseling and assistance to a state employee.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-50-604, amend 3 (1) (k) (III) as follows: 4 24-50-604. **Powers** and duties of the director. 5 (1) (k) (III) Dependents of a state employee are not eligible to participate 6 BE THE SOLE AND DIRECT RECIPIENT OF SERVICES in any employee 7 assistance program established and operated pursuant to this paragraph 8 (k); EXCEPT THAT AN EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM MAY ALLOW A 9 DEPENDENT OR ANY OTHER PERSON WHO IS NOT A STATE EMPLOYEE TO 10 PARTICIPATE IN AN EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM IF SUCH 11 PARTICIPATION IS NECESSARY TO PROVIDE EFFECTIVE COUNSELING AND 12 ASSISTANCE TO A STATE EMPLOYEE. **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, 13 14 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 15 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
