2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-9-106, amend (1)
3	(e) as follows:
4	18-9-106. Disorderly conduct. (1) A person commits disorderly
5	conduct if he or she intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly:
6	(e) Not being a peace officer, discharges a firearm in a public
7	place except when engaged in lawful target practice or hunting OR THE
8	RITUAL DISCHARGE OF BLANK AMMUNITION CARTRIDGES AS AN ATTENDEE
9	AT A FUNERAL FOR A DECEASED PERSON WHO WAS A VETERAN OF THE
10	ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES; or
11	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
12	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
13	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
