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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101     **CONCERNING THE EXPANSION OF DUTIES OF THE LEGISLATIVE**  
102             **EMERGENCY EPIDEMIC RESPONSE COMMITTEE TO INCLUDE**  
103             **PREPARATION FOR DISASTER EMERGENCIES, AND, IN**  
104             **CONNECTION THEREWITH, CHANGING THE NAME OF THE**

The bill broadens the scope of the current legislative emergency epidemic response committee (committee) to allow the committee to prepare for disaster as well as epidemic emergencies. The bill also changes the name of the committee to the legislative emergency preparedness, response, and recovery committee to reflect the broadened scope of the committee.

Additionally, the bill gives the committee the authority to recommend legislation pertaining to the preparedness, response, and recovery by, and continuation of operations of, the general assembly and the legislative service agencies in the event of an emergency epidemic or disaster.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** 2-3-1501, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended  
3 to read:

4 **2-3-1501. Legislative declaration.** The general assembly hereby  
5 finds and determines that in the event of an emergency epidemic OR  
6 DISASTER in the state, the general assembly must be prepared to respond  
7 to the emergency EPIDEMIC OR DISASTER and have a plan for ensuring the  
8 continuation of its operations in order to assist in the protection of the  
9 health, safety, and welfare of the public.

10 **SECTION 2.** 2-3-1502 (7), Colorado Revised Statutes, is  
11 amended, and the said 2-3-1502 is further amended BY THE ADDITION  
12 OF A NEW SUBSECTION, to read:

13 **2-3-1502. Definitions.** As used in this part 15, unless the context  
14 otherwise requires:

15 (3.5) "DISASTER" MEANS THE OCCURRENCE OR IMMINENT THREAT  
16 OF WIDESPREAD OR SEVERE DAMAGE, INJURY, ILLNESS, OR LOSS OF LIFE OR  
17 PROPERTY RESULTING FROM AN EPIDEMIC OR A NATURAL, MAN-MADE, OR

1 TECHNOLOGICAL CAUSE.

2 (7) "Legislative committee" means the legislative emergency  
3 epidemic PREPAREDNESS, response, AND RECOVERY committee created in  
4 this part 15.

5 **SECTION 3.** 2-3-1503 (1) (a) and (2), Colorado Revised Statutes,  
6 are amended to read:

7 **2-3-1503. Legislative emergency preparedness, response, and**  
8 **recovery committee - creation - membership - duties.** (1) (a) There  
9 is hereby created a legislative emergency epidemic PREPAREDNESS,  
10 response, AND RECOVERY committee. The legislative committee shall  
11 develop a plan for the response by, and continuation of operations of, the  
12 general assembly and the legislative service agencies in the event of an  
13 emergency epidemic OR DISASTER. The legislative committee shall  
14 cooperate and coordinate with the council, the division, the department,  
15 and the GEEERC in developing the plan. The legislative committee shall  
16 develop and submit the plan to the speaker of the house of  
17 representatives, the president of the senate, the governor, the executive  
18 director of the department, the council, the director of the division, and  
19 the GEEERC no later than ~~July 1, 2008~~ JULY 1, 2011. The legislative  
20 committee shall meet at least annually to review and amend the plan as  
21 necessary and shall provide any updated plan to the persons or entities  
22 specified in this paragraph (a). THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE MAY  
23 RECOMMEND LEGISLATION PERTAINING TO THE PREPAREDNESS, RESPONSE,  
24 AND RECOVERY BY, AND CONTINUATION OF OPERATIONS OF, THE GENERAL  
25 ASSEMBLY AND THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICE AGENCIES IN THE EVENT OF AN  
26 EMERGENCY EPIDEMIC OR DISASTER. The legislative committee shall  
27 provide information to and fully cooperate with the council, the division,

1 the department, and the GEEERC in fulfilling its duties under this  
2 section.

3 (2) In the event of an emergency epidemic OR DISASTER that the  
4 governor declares to be a disaster emergency pursuant to section  
5 24-32-2104, C.R.S., the legislative committee shall convene as rapidly  
6 and as often as necessary to advise the speaker of the house of  
7 representatives, the president of the senate, and the legislative service  
8 agencies regarding reasonable and appropriate measures to be taken by  
9 the general assembly and the legislative service agencies to respond to the  
10 emergency epidemic OR DISASTER and protect THE public health, SAFETY,  
11 AND WELFARE. The legislative committee shall communicate, cooperate,  
12 and seek advice and assistance from the council, the division, the  
13 department, and the GEEERC in responding to the emergency epidemic  
14 OR DISASTER.

15 **SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
16 shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
17 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August  
18 11, 2010, if adjournment sine die is on May 12, 2010); except that, if a  
19 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the  
20 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act  
21 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not take effect  
22 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
23 November 2010 and shall take effect on the date of the official  
24 declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
