101 **CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER**

Bill Summary

Currently, only peace officers are allowed to perform certified vehicle identification number inspections. The bill would allow county sheriffs and municipal police chiefs to certify individuals to perform the inspections if they complete the inspection training provided by the police

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** 42-5-201 (5), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
3 amended to read:

4 **42-5-201. Definitions.** As used in this part 2, unless the context
5 otherwise requires:

6 (5) "Inspector" means a duly constituted peace officer of a law
7 enforcement agency OR OTHER INDIVIDUAL who has been certified
8 pursuant to ~~section 42-5-206 (1) or (2)~~ SECTION 42-5-206 to inspect
9 vehicle identification numbers.

10 **SECTION 2.** 42-5-206, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended
11 BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION to read:

12 **42-5-206. Certification of inspectors.** (3) THE SHERIFF OF ANY
13 COUNTY AND THE POLICE CHIEF OF ANY MUNICIPALITY MAY CERTIFY
14 INDIVIDUALS IN ADDITION TO PEACE OFFICERS TO SERVE AS INSPECTORS IN
15 ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS PART 2. SUCH INDIVIDUALS
16 MAY BE EMPLOYEES OF A COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY AND SHALL
17 SATISFACTORILY COMPLETE FINGERPRINT AND BACKGROUND CHECKS.
18 SUCH INDIVIDUALS MUST SATISFACTORILY COMPLETE A VEHICLE
19 IDENTIFICATION NUMBER INSPECTION TRAINING COURSE APPROVED BY THE
20 PEACE OFFICERS STANDARDS AND TRAINING BOARD AND PAY A FEE TO THE
21 BOARD FOR THE COST OF THE CERTIFICATION NOT TO EXCEED
22 TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS. THE COST OF THE TRAINING COURSE SHALL
23 INCLUDE ALL NECESSARY AND ACTUAL EXPENSES BUT SHALL NOT EXCEED
24 FIFTY DOLLARS PER INDIVIDUAL.

25 **SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act

1 shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
2 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
3 11, 2010, if adjournment sine die is on May 12, 2010); except that, if a
4 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
5 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
6 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not take effect
7 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
8 November 2010 and shall take effect on the date of the official
9 declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
