Currently, only peace officers are allowed to perform certified vehicle identification number inspections. shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 1 2 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 3 11, 2010, if adjournment sine die is on May 12, 2010); except that, if a 4 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 5 6 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not take effect 7 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 8 November 2010 and shall take effect on the date of the official 9 declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
