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A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING ELIMINATING CERTAIN STATE ASSESSMENTS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, the department of education administers state assessments in English language arts and mathematics to students in grades 3 through 9 and administers state assessments in social studies to students once in elementary school, once in middle school, and once in high school. The bill repeals administration of the ninth-grade English language arts and mathematics state assessments and the state social

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1006.3, amend 3 (1)(a) introductory portion and (1)(a)(I); and repeal (1)(a)(III) and (1)(b) as follows: 4 5 22-7-1006.3. State assessments - administration - rules. 6 (1) (a) Beginning in the 2015-16 school year, the department of 7 education, in collaboration with local education providers, shall 8 administer the state assessments in the instructional areas of English 9 language arts, mathematics, AND science, and social studies, as adopted 10 by the state board pursuant to section 22-7-1006, as follows: 11 (I) The department shall administer a state assessment in English 12 language arts and a state assessment in mathematics to all students 13 enrolled in grades three through nine EIGHT in public schools throughout 14 the state. 15 (III) The department shall administer a state assessment in social 16 studies to students enrolled in public elementary, middle, and high 17 schools throughout the state. The department shall select the specific 18 grades in which to administer the state social studies assessment, ensuring 19 that students take the state social studies assessment once in elementary 20 school, once in middle school, and once in high school; except that the 21 department shall not administer the state social studies assessment to 22 students enrolled in twelfth grade. The department shall administer the 23 social studies assessment in a representative sample of public schools 24 each school year, ensuring that it administers the social studies 25 assessment in each public school at least once every three years. A school

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district, for one or more of the schools of the school district that are not included in the representative sample, or a charter school that is not included in the representative sample, may request that the department administer the assessment in the district school or charter school. The department shall administer the social studies assessment in the requested school in the school year following the school year in which it receives the request. (b) As soon as practicable after May 20, 2015, the department of education shall apply to the federal department of education for a waiver of federal statutory and regulatory requirements as may be necessary to allow the department to satisfy the federal high school assessment requirements by administering assessments in English language arts and mathematics to students enrolled in ninth grade. **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1006.1, amend (1) introductory portion as follows: 22-7-1006.1. Assessment selection - department of education

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22-7-1006.1. Assessment selection - department of education - study - legislative declaration - repeal. (1) The department of education shall investigate and review the options available to the state for selecting the state assessments in mathematics, English language arts, AND science, and social studies, including options for allowing local education providers to select and administer their own assessments in these subjects for use in the state accountability system. The department, at a minimum, shall consider:
