Bill Summary

The bill extends through the 2011-12 fiscal year authorization for

the use of highway users tax fund moneys to fund driver and vehicle services within the division of motor vehicles in the department of revenue.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 SECTION 1. 43-4-201 (3) (a) (III) (C), Colorado Revised 3 Statutes, is amended to read: 4 **43-4-201.** Funds created. (3) (a) (III) (C) The general assembly 5 shall not make any annual appropriation or statutory distribution from the 6 highway users tax fund for the fiscal year 1997-98 or for any succeeding 7 fiscal year authorized by subparagraph (II) of this paragraph (a), 8 excluding the annual appropriation or statutory distribution to the 9 Colorado state patrol and the ports of entry section and excluding any 10 appropriation to the department of revenue for the fiscal years 2008-09, 11 2009-10, and 2010-11, AND 2011-12, for expenses incurred in connection 12 with the administration of article 2 of title 42, C.R.S., by the division of 13 motor vehicles within the department. 14 SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, 15 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate

16 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
