Bill Summary

Joint Budget Committee. For the 2017-18 fiscal year, the bill transfers \$2,888,529 from the general fund to the information technology capital account of the capital construction fund.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-75-302, amend
3	(2.3)(b) and (2.3)(c); and add (2.3)(d) as follows:
4	24-75-302. Capital construction fund - capital assessment fees
5	- calculation - information technology capital account. (2.3) In
6	addition to the sums transferred pursuant to subsections (2) and (2.5) of
7	this section, the state treasurer and the controller shall transfer a sum as
8	specified in this subsection (2.3) from the general fund to the information
9	technology capital account created in subsection (3.7) of this section, as
10	enacted by House Bill 15-1266, as money becomes available in the
11	general fund during the fiscal year beginning on July 1 of the fiscal year
12	in which the transfer is made. Transfers between funds pursuant to this
13	subsection (2.3) are not appropriations subject to the limitations of section
14	24-75-201.1. The amounts transferred pursuant to this subsection (2.3) are
15	as follows:
16	(b) On July 1, 2016, ten million six hundred ninety-seven
17	thousand four hundred nine dollars; and
18	(c) On July 1, 2017, nineteen million eight hundred fifty-five
19	thousand five hundred fifteen dollars; AND
20	(d) On April 1, 2018, two million eight hundred
21	EIGHTY-EIGHT THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY-NINE DOLLARS.
22	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
23	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
24	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
