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Department of Health Care Policy and Financing, Grand Totals; Department of Higher Education, College Opportunity Fund Program, Fee-for-service Contracts with State Institutions, Fee-for-service Contracts with State Institutions for Specialty Education Programs; and Governing Boards, Regents of the University of Colorado -- The Department of Higher Education shall transfer \$800,000 to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing for administrative costs and family medicine residency placements associated with care provided by the faculty of the health sciences center campus at the University of Colorado that are eligible for payment pursuant to Section 25.5-4-401, C.R.S. # SECTION 2. Appropriation to the department of health care policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020. (1) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, \$887,397 is appropriated to the department of health care policy and financing and is for the payment of overexpenditures of line item appropriations contained in Part V of section 2 of chapter 326 (HB 20-1360), Session Laws of Colorado 2020, as follows:

- (a) \$150,021 from the healthcare affordability and sustainability fee cash fund created in Section 25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., for behavioral health capitation payments;
- (b) \$206,066 from the general fund for behavioral health fee-for-service payments;
- (c) \$50,955 from the healthcare affordability and sustainability fee cash fund created in Section 25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., for behavioral health fee-for-service payments; and
- (d) \$480,355 from the healthcare affordability and sustainability fee cash fund created in Section 25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., for children's basic health plan medical and dental costs.
- (2) In accordance with section 24-75-109 (4)(a), C.R.S., all restrictions on funds for the department of health care policy and financing for the 2021-22 state fiscal year for the amounts and items of appropriation listed in this section are released.
