101	CONCERNING INCREASING THE AVAILABILITY OF SUPPLEMENTAL
102	ONLINE EDUCATION RESOURCES, AND, IN CONNECTION

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, a board of cooperative services (BOCES) is designated to make supplemental online education courses, teacher

professional development, and consulting services available to school districts, charter schools, and other BOCES (local education providers). The designated BOCES contracts with nonprofit entities to provide these services.

The bill creates the statewide supplemental online and blended learning program (program) to better administer the availability of these courses and services. The designated BOCES is charged with leading and administering the program, which includes creating a statewide plan for making supplemental online and blended learning resources available to local education providers. In administering the program, the designated BOCES may contract with multiple nonprofit providers for the supplemental online education courses, professional development, and consulting services. The designated BOCES must also actively market the program to local education providers. The designated BOCES may expend up to 10 % of the amount appropriated for the program to offset the increased costs of administering the program.

6 (1) The short title of this section is the "Empowering Digital

- 7 LEARNING FOR ALL ACT".
 - (1) (2) (a) (I) The general assembly finds that:

9 (A) Online education courses that are supplemental to the 10 education program provided by a school district, charter school, or 11 BOCES are a valuable resource for schools because they allow a school district, charter school, or BOCES to provide a much richer, more varied 12 13 curriculum of courses for students at all levels of achievement. Many 14 small school districts and rural communities, however, lack the capacity and resources to develop their own supplemental online courses and 15 16 blended learning strategies THE OVERWHELMING INFLUENCE OF THE 1 RAPIDLY EVOLVING USE OF TECHNOLOGY AND THE INTERNET WILL RENDER. 2 HIGH-QUALITY REMOTE DIGITAL EDUCATIONAL CONTENT ALMOST 3 COST-FREE AFTER A PERIOD OF DECLINING COSTS. ACCESS TO DIGITAL 4 CONTENT AND EDUCATIONAL COURSES IS ALREADY AN ESSENTIAL PART OF 5 THE HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM, BUT IS NOT WIDELY APPLIED IN 6 ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION. WHILE SOME SCHOOL 7 DISTRICTS HAVE BEEN ABLE TO KEEP PACE WITH THE CHANGING CONTEXT 8 OF PUBLIC EDUCATION, MOST HAVE NOT.

9 (B) Supplemental online education courses provide tools for 10 school districts, charter schools, and BOCES to use in decreasing the 11 college remediation rates and in helping their students comply with the 12 higher education admission guidelines; THE SCOPE OF THE COMING 13 CHANGE IN THE DELIVERY OF PUBLIC EDUCATION SERVICES IS MASSIVE 14 AND MORE FAR-REACHING THAN THE CURRENTLY AVAILABLE CONSTRUCTS 15 OF ONLINE LEARNING OR BLENDED LEARNING. THE SCOPE OF THE CHANGE 16 IS SUCH THAT EVERY PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE STATE MUST EVOLVE INTO A 17 DIGITAL LEARNING ENVIRONMENT THAT CAPITALIZES ON THE 18 STUDENT-TEACHER RELATIONSHIP WHILE LEVERAGING THE ADVANCES 19 THAT THE TECHNOLOGY REVOLUTION BRINGS.

20 (C) The cost of supplemental online education courses is 21 prohibitive for many school districts, charter schools, and BOCES whose 22 students may be most in need of these courses. Because of the value of 23 these courses, it is appropriate that the state provide moneys to assist 24 school districts, charter schools, and BOCES in purchasing supplemental 25 online education courses THE PUBLIC EDUCATION SYSTEM MUST TAKE 26 ADVANTAGE OF THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVE 27 STATEWIDE EDUCATIONAL EQUITY BY DELIVERING EDUCATIONAL

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SERVICES THROUGH THE DIGITAL LEARNING ENVIRONMENT. IT IS LIKELY
 THAT FAILURE TO EMBRACE THIS CHANGE IN THE DELIVERY OF PUBLIC
 EDUCATION SERVICES WILL LEAD TO A DECLINE IN THE EQUITY AND
 QUALITY OF THE SYSTEM OF PUBLIC EDUCATION IN COLORADO.

5 (D) COLORADO LACKS A CLEARLY ARTICULATED AND ACCEPTED 6 VISION AND PLAN TO IMPLEMENT THE SHIFT IN DELIVERING EDUCATIONAL 7 SERVICES TO A DIGITAL ENVIRONMENT, WHICH MUST OCCUR TO 8 ADEQUATELY PREPARE STUDENTS FOR POSTSECONDARY SUCCESS. IT IS 9 CRUCIAL THAT THE STATE IDENTIFY A SINGLE PUBLIC ENTITY TO PROVIDE 10 LEADERSHIP IN DESIGNING AND IMPLEMENTING A STATEWIDE PLAN FOR 11 INCREASING THE AVAILABILITY OF SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATIONAL 12 COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER 13 SCHOOLS, AND BOCES.

14 (II) It is therefore in the best interests of the state to invest 15 INCREASE ITS INVESTMENT in the expansion of affordable, high-quality 16 supplemental online education courses and blended learning support for 17 school districts, charter schools, and BOCES, especially those that lack 18 the capacity to develop their own supplemental ONLINE EDUCATION 19 COURSE offerings, by subsidizing the provision of SUPPLEMENTAL online 20 education courses, professional development, and technical assistance to 21 implement SUPPLEMENTAL online and blended learning statewide.

(III) Due to its experience in assisting school districts with
 SUPPLEMENTAL online EDUCATION COURSES and blended learning in
 Colorado, it is further in the best interests of the state to designate a
 BOCES to contract through a request for a proposal process that adheres
 to the goals set forth in paragraph (a.5) of this subsection (1) developed
 in consultation with the department, with one or more nonprofit providers

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1 to provide resources for school districts, charter schools, and BOCES in 2 the form of supplemental online course offerings, professional 3 development for educators, and consulting assistance for schools and 4 school districts wanting to use online and blended learning for their 5 students. In contracting with providers, the priority shall result in the 6 expansion of student access to quality supplemental online courses and 7 resources available to implement supplemental online and blended 8 learning in school districts, charter schools, and BOCES statewide 9 ARTICULATE THE STATEWIDE PLAN FOR SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND 10 BLENDED LEARNING AND TO LEAD, MANAGE, AND ADMINISTER THE 11 STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM IN 12 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION. 13 (a.5) The general assembly also finds that the goals of online 14 courses and blended learning strategies are to: 15 (I) Expand the availability of online courses and blended learning 16 strategies; 17 (II) Increase the number of students taking high-quality, effective, 18 and affordable online courses: 19 (III) Establish a program to work with school districts, charter 20 schools, and BOCES to create, offer, and sustain their own high-quality, 21 effective, and affordable blended learning courses, as well as targeted 22 professional development and mentoring support; 23 (IV) Increase the capacity of educators in school districts, charter 24 schools, and BOCES to utilize standards, data, and interventions in 25 regular, online, and blended learning classes; and 26 (V) Document and share best practices in online and blended

27 learning.

(b) It is further the intent of The general assembly DECLARES that
 the amount necessary to reduce the cost to school districts, charter
 schools, and BOCES of purchasing supplemental online education
 courses IMPLEMENT THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND
 BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM MAY be appropriated annually from federal
 mineral leasing revenues transferred to the state public school fund
 pursuant to section 34-63-102, C.R.S., and section 22-54-114 (1).

8 (c) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FURTHER DECLARES THAT, FOR 9 PURPOSES OF SECTION 17 OF ARTICLE IX OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION, THE 10 STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM IS 11 AN IMPORTANT ELEMENT IN IMPLEMENTING ACCOUNTABLE EDUCATION 12 REFORM AND ENABLING SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND 13 BOCES TO MEET STATE ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND MAY THEREFORE 14 RECEIVE FUNDING FROM THE STATE EDUCATION FUND CREATED IN SECTION 15 17 (4) OF ARTICLE IX OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION.

"LOCAL PUBLIC EDUCATION AGENCY" MEANS A SCHOOL 6 (f) 7 DISTRICT, BOCES, OR CHARTER SCHOOL. 8 (d) (g) "Provider" means an A NONPROFIT entity OR A LOCAL 9 PUBLIC EDUCATION AGENCY that sells PROVIDES: 10 (I) Supplemental online education courses that are taught by 11 employees of the provider who are teachers licensed in Colorado pursuant to article 60.5 of this title; 12 13 (II) PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT RESOURCES FOR TEACHERS; OR 14 (III) CONSULTING SERVICES FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER 15 SCHOOLS, AND BOCES WITH REGARD TO PROVIDING SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATION COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING. 16 17 (h) "SMALL RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT" MEANS A SCHOOL DISTRICT 18 IN COLORADO THAT THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES IS RURAL, BASED ON 19 THE GEOGRAPHIC SIZE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE DISTANCE OF THE 20 SCHOOL DISTRICT FROM THE NEAREST LARGE, URBANIZED AREA, AND THAT 21 ENROLLS FEWER THAN ONE THOUSAND STUDENTS IN KINDERGARTEN 22 THROUGH TWELFTH GRADE. 23 (i) "STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM" OR "PROGRAM" MEANS THE PROGRAM DESCRIBED IN 24 25 SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION. "Supplemental online education course" means an 26 (e) (j) 27 education course that is:

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(I) Taught by a teacher who is licensed pursuant to article 60.5 of

4 format to one or more students at a location that is remote from the
5 delivery point; and

9 (4) (a) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATEWIDE 10 ASSOCIATION OF BOCES, SHALL DESIGNATE A BOCES TO LEAD, MANAGE, 11 AND ADMINISTER THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED 12 LEARNING PROGRAM AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION. 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(III) WORKING WITH SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND
 BOCES TO CREATE, OFFER, AND SUSTAIN THEIR OWN HIGH-QUALITY,
 EFFECTIVE, AND AFFORDABLE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATION
 COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING, AS WELL AS TARGETED PROFESSIONAL
 DEVELOPMENT AND MENTORING SUPPORT;

6 (IV) ASSISTING EDUCATORS IN LOCAL PUBLIC EDUCATION
7 AGENCIES TO INCREASE THEIR COMPETENCY SPECIFICALLY IN USING
8 DIGITAL LEARNING STRATEGIES TO LEAD AND INSTRUCT IN, AND
9 OTHERWISE IMPLEMENT, DIGITAL LEARNING; AND

(V) DOCUMENTING AND SHARING BEST PRACTICES IN PROVIDING
 SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATION COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING.

12 (5) (a) IN LEADING THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND 13 BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM, THE ADMINISTERING BOCES, IN 14 PARTNERSHIP WITH THE COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION, THE STATE BOARD 15 OF EDUCATION AND ONE OR MORE PRIVATE, NONPROFIT ENTITIES, SHALL 16 PREPARE A PLAN FOR INTEGRATING SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED 17 LEARNING INTO THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS PROVIDED BY SCHOOL 18 DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND BOCES. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, 19 CHARTER SCHOOL, AND BOCES MAY DETERMINE THE EXTENT TO WHICH 20 IT PARTICIPATES IN THE STATEWIDE PLAN.

(b) THE ADMINISTERING BOCES SHALL ENSURE THAT, THROUGH
THE PROGRAM, ALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND BOCES
IN THE STATE HAVE ACCESS TO:

(I) SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING RESOURCES,
INCLUDING, AT A MINIMUM, SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATION COURSES
AVAILABLE FROM CONTRACT PROVIDERS OR FROM A SCHOOL DISTRICT,
CHARTER SCHOOL, OR BOCES AND A LIBRARY OF DIGITAL COURSE

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1 CONTENT;

2 (II) PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT RESOURCES FOR TEACHERS,
3 INCLUDING RESOURCES FOR CERTIFYING TEACHERS' ABILITY TO
4 SUCCESSFULLY INTEGRATE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED
5 LEARNING RESOURCES INTO SCHOOL-BUILDING-BASED EDUCATIONAL
6 PROGRAMS; AND

7 (III) CONSULTING ASSISTANCE FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER
8 SCHOOLS, AND BOCES THAT CHOOSE TO USE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND
9 BLENDED LEARNING FOR STUDENTS, INCLUDING AN INVENTORY OF
10 SUCCESSFUL MODELS FOR INTEGRATING SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE
11 EDUCATION COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING INTO
12 SCHOOL-BUILDING-BASED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.

13 (c) THE ADMINISTERING BOCES SHALL ACTIVELY MARKET TO
14 SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND BOCES THE AVAILABILITY
15 OF RESOURCES THROUGH THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND
16 BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM.

17 (d) THE ADMINISTERING BOCES MAY ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT
18 WITH THE STATEWIDE INTERNET PORTAL AUTHORITY CREATED IN ARTICLE
19 37.7 OF TITLE 24, C.R.S., TO PROVIDE THE PLATFORM FOR ACCESSING
20 SERVICES AND PROGRAMS AVAILABLE THROUGH THE STATEWIDE
21 SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM.

(3) (6) (a) On or before February 15, 2015, and on or before
 February 15 of every third year thereafter, the BOCES designated
 pursuant to subsection (4) of this section shall, subject to available
 appropriations, create THE ADMINISTERING BOCES SHALL ESTABLISH a
 fair and transparent request for a proposal process to select one or more
 nonprofit USE WHEN SELECTING providers to provide resources for school

1 districts, charter schools, and BOCES in the form of supplemental online 2 course offerings, professional development for educators, and consulting 3 assistance for school districts, charter schools, and BOCES wanting to 4 use online and blended learning for students. THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL PROCESS MUST 9 INCLUDE INPUT FROM A REVIEW COMMITTEE AS DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 10 (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION (6) THAT THE ADMINISTERING BOCES CONVENES 11 AS NEEDED 12 (b) THE REVIEW COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF: 13 (I) A representative from the designated ADMINISTERING BOCES; 14 (II) A representative from the office in the department responsible 15 for online and blended learning; 16 THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS SELECTED JOINTLY BY THE (III) 17 ADMINISTERING BOCES AND THE DEPARTMENT: 18 (A) A national expert in online and blended learning; to be 19 selected by the designated BOCES and the department; 20 (B) An administrator from A SCHOOL THAT IS DESIGNATED an 21 alternative education campus school to be selected by the designated 22 BOCES and the department AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 22-7-604.5; and 23 (C) An administrator from a school that purchases OBTAINS online 24 or blended services to be selected by the designated BOCES and the 25 department. The committee must convene at least ninety days prior to the

26 release of the request for proposals THROUGH THE PROGRAM; AND

27 (IV) TWO EDUCATORS AS FOLLOWS:

(A) ONE EDUCATOR APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, OR HIS OR HER
 DESIGNEE, WHO HAS EXPERIENCE WITH SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE
 EDUCATION OR BLENDED LEARNING; AND

4 (B) ONE EDUCATOR SELECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT WHO IS
5 EMPLOYED IN A SMALL RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE DEPARTMENT IS
6 ENCOURAGED TO SELECT AN EDUCATOR WHO HAS EXPERIENCE WITH
7 SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATION OR BLENDED LEARNING.

8 (c) The REVIEW committee shall review all proposals using an 9 established rubric RUBRICS and shall recommend one or more providers 10 for approval to the ADMINISTERING BOCES. designated pursuant to 11 subsection (4) of this section. If the designated ADMINISTERING BOCES 12 chooses not to follow the recommendations of the REVIEW committee 13 concerning any A provider, it shall provide the REVIEW committee with a 14 written explanation of its rationale for so doing THE RATIONALE FOR THE 15 DECISION.

(d) A PROVIDER THAT THE ADMINISTERING BOCES CONTRACTS
WITH PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (6) MAY SUBCONTRACT WITH ONE OR
MORE FOR-PROFIT OR NONPROFIT ENTITIES, LOCAL PUBLIC EDUCATION
AGENCIES, OR PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS IN MEETING THE OBLIGATIONS OF
ITS CONTRACT WITH THE ADMINISTERING BOCES.

(3.3) (7) Supplemental online education courses must be provided
 to a purchasing school district, charter school, or BOCES at an affordable
 total program cost for high-quality, accredited courses with local support.
 (3.5) (8) Each high school student in Colorado may take at least
 one supplemental online course per year. The EACH supplemental online
 course CONTRACT provider shall report to the ADMINISTERING BOCES
 designated pursuant to subsection (4) of this section which INFORMATION

CONCERNING THE students are participating WHO PARTICIPATE in THE 1 2 supplemental online courses so TO ENABLE the ADMINISTERING BOCES 3 designated pursuant to subsection (4) of this section can TO track student 4 THE STUDENTS' academic performance for those students taking IN THE 5 supplemental online courses. The ADMINISTERING BOCES designated 6 pursuant to subsection (4) of this section shall annually collect data 7 related to completion and passage rates from any nonprofit THE providers 8 selected CONTRACTED to provide SUPPLEMENTAL online and blended 9 learning and report that data to the department. The data collected by the 10 department must be collected SHALL COLLECT THE DATA through existing 11 student data collection systems and in compliance with all state and 12 federal laws and regulations concerning the privacy of information, 13 including but not limited to the federal "Family Education Rights and 14 Privacy Act of 1974", 20 U.S.C. sec. 1232g, as amended.
