### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING MEASURES TO DEVELOP INNOVATIVE EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS THAT SUPPORT DEEPER LEARNING.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires the department of education (department) to cap standardized summative assessments administered to the minimum extent possible, if requested by the local education provider.

The bill requires the department to apply for a federal waiver for federal assessment requirements.

The bill requires the department to support, through various

means, local education providers and schools to innovate new assessments.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

The state should cultivate and honor local visions for success, local processes for self-improvement, and promote meaningful collaboration between communities in their processes.
- (i) THE PEOPLE OF COLORADO DESIRE TO DEVELOP LOCAL ASSESSMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEMS THAT EQUITABLY ENCOURAGE AND EVALUATE STUDENT LEARNING AND ALLOW STUDENTS, REGARDLESS OF THEIR DEMOGRAPHICS OR EXPERIENCES, TO DEMONSTRATE THEIR TALENTS, CAPABILITIES, AND PROGRESS.
