Bill Summary

The bill creates the office of cardiac arrest management (office) in the department of public health and environment.

The office is required to:

- Facilitate the registration of defibrillators in this state through the implementation of a statewide registry;
- Coordinate cardiac arrest data, including outcome data from facilities that treat cardiac patients and from coroners;
- Implement an outreach campaign to raise public awareness regarding cardiac arrest;
- Provide training and education programs statewide to teach the skills necessary to save lives; and
- Employ a statewide cardiac arrest data coordinator, a defibrillator registry coordinator, and other personnel as necessary.

The bill requires the general assembly to appropriate \$500,000 annually for use by the office.

22	(IV) ENCOURAGE ALL RESIDENTS OF COLORADO TO ENGAGE IN

24	(c) MAINTAIN A LIST OF TRAINING AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS
25	OFFERED IN THE STATE THAT:
26	(I) TEACH LIFE-SAVING SKILLS, INCLUDING CARDIOPULMONARY
27	RESUSCITATION AND THE USE OF A DEFIBRILLATOR; AND

1	(II) COMPLY WITH THE GUIDELINES PUBLISHED BY THE AMERICAN
2	HEART ASSOCIATION;
3	(d) EMPLOY A STATEWIDE CARDIAC ARREST DATA COORDINATOR
4	AND OTHER PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY TO ACCOMPLISH THE PURPOSES OF
5	THIS SECTION; AND
6	(e) COORDINATE THE SUBMISSION OF DATA, INCLUDING THE
7	GLOBAL POSITIONING SYSTEM LOCATION OF PUBLIC ACCESS
8	DEFIBRILLATORS TO AN AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR REGISTRY
9	DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
10	(3) THE OFFICE MAY:
11	(a) ACQUIRE, ANALYZE, AND OVERSEE CARDIAC ARREST DATA;
12	(b) RELEASE REPORTS GENERATED FROM THE DATA; AND
13	(c) SHARE THE DATA WITH:
14	(I) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDERS, DISPATCH
15	CENTERS, HOSPITALS, AND OTHER ENTITIES AS APPROPRIATE TO ASSIST
16	WITH EMERGENCY RESPONSE CAPABILITIES;
17	(II) APPROPRIATE ENTITIES AS REQUESTED FOR RESEARCH
18	PURPOSES;
19	(III) DESIGNATED STATE AND NATIONAL CARDIAC ARREST
20	REGISTRIES; AND
21	(IV) D ESIGNATED STATE AND NATIONAL AUTOMATED EXTERNAL

23	(4) (a) For state fiscal year 2022-23, and for each state
24	FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL APPROPRIATE
25	TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE
26	DEPARTMENT FOR ALLOCATION TO THE OFFICE FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS
27	SECTION.

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1	(b) THE DEPARTMENT MAY SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND GIFTS,
2	GRANTS, AND DONATIONS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.
3	(5) THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH MAY PROMULGATE RULES TO
4	IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.
5	SECTION 2. Appropriation. For the 2022-23 state fiscal year,
6	\$200,000 is appropriated to the department of public health and
7	environment for use by the health facilities and emergency medical
8	services division. This appropriation is from the general fund. To
9	implement this act, the division may use this appropriation for the office
10	of cardiac arrest related to emergency medical services.
11	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
12	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
13	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
14	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
15	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
16	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
17	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
18	November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
19	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
