A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE CREATION OF AN ON-LINE DATABASE FOR A STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION'S FINANCIAL INFORMATION, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

Currently, the state's revenues and expenditures that are included in the state's official book of record are included in a free, searchable web-based system that is known as the transparency on-line project. A state institution of higher education's transactions are not included in the state's official book of record, and, accordingly, its revenues and expenditures are not included in the web-based system.

The bill requires each state institution of higher education to develop, maintain, and make publicly available a searchable, on-line revenue and expenditure database. A state institution is required to include and exclude in its database the same information relating to each revenue and expenditure transaction that the department of transportation is required to include in its revenue and expenditure database. In addition to requiring transparency of all employee salaries anonymously, for each professor, a state institution is required to include information related not only to salary, but also the number of classes the professor personally taught, benefits paid by the institution, travel-related expenses, and grants received.

For purposes of the bill, a "state institution of higher education" is defined to mean a public postsecondary institution that is governed by:

- ! The board of governors of the Colorado state university system;
- ! The board of regents of the university of Colorado;
- ! The board of trustees of the Colorado school of mines; or
- ! The board of trustees of the university of northern Colorado.

The web-based system is required to include a link to all on-line databases.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-72.4-101, amend

3 (3) (a) (II), (3) (a) (III), and (3) (b); and **add** (3) (a) (I.5) as follows:

4 **24-72.4-101. Legislative declaration.** (3) (a) The general assembly further finds and declares that:

- (I.5) THE TRANSACTIONS OF A STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION ARE NOT INCLUDED IN THE STATE'S OFFICIAL BOOK OF RECORD;
- (II) Because of accounting and information technology differences, it is not feasible to fully assimilate the department of transportation OR STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION into the

2	(III) Taxpayers should still be able to access the details of the
3	department of transportation's OR A STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER
4	EDUCATION'S finances.
5	(b) Now, therefore, it is the intent of the general assembly that the
6	department of transportation AND STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER
7	EDUCATION be required to create and maintain a searchable, on-line
8	revenue and expenditure database DATABASES and that such information
9	should be accessible through the web-based system.

14	(1) No later than July 1, 2013, each state institution of higher
15	EDUCATION SHALL DEVELOP, MAINTAIN, AND MAKE PUBLICLY AVAILABLE
16	A SEARCHABLE, ON-LINE REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE DATABASE.
17	(2) EXCEPT AS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION, A
18	STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL INCLUDE AND EXCLUDE
19	IN ITS ON-LINE DATABASE ALL THE SAME INFORMATION RELATED TO ITS

13	(b) A STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL
14	SEPARATELY IDENTIFY EACH PROFESSOR AND THE ASSOCIATED
15	INFORMATION REQUIRED TO BE LISTED BY PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS
16	SUBSECTION (3).
17	(4) A STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION MAY INCLUDE
18	ANY OTHER INFORMATION IN ITS ON-LINE DATABASE THAT THE STATE
19	INSTITUTION DETERMINES WILL INCREASE TRANSPARENCY.
20	SECTION 6. Appropriation. (1) In addition to any other
21	appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the
22	general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of higher
23	education, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, the sum of
24	\$1,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be allocated for
25	the implementation of this act as follows:
26	(a) \$250,000 for the board of governors of the Colorado state
27	university system;

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1	(b) \$250,000 for the board of regents of the university of
2	Colorado;
3	(c) \$250,000 for the board of trustees of the Colorado school of
4	mines; and
5	(d) \$250,000 for the board of trustees of the university of northern
6	Colorado.
7	(2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby
8	appropriated, out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise
9	appropriated, to the department of the governor - lieutenant governor -
10	state planning and budgeting, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012,
11	the sum of \$43,781 and 0.5 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
12	for allocation to the office of information technology for on-line posting
13	costs related to the implementation of this act.
14	SECTION 7. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
15	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
16	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
17	8, 2012, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2012); except that, if a
18	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
19	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
20	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
21	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
22	November 2012 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
23	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
