Bill Summary

The bill appropriates money from the species conservation trust fund for programs submitted by the executive director of the department SENATE 3rd Reading Unamended April 27, 2015







of natural resources that are designed to conserve native species that have been listed as threatened or endangered under state or federal law or that are candidate species or are likely to become candidate species as determined by the United States fish and wildlife service.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) Pursuant to:

(a) Section 24-33-111 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes, the species
conservation trust fund has been created in the state treasury to fund
programs designed to conserve native species that have been listed as
threatened or endangered under state or federal law or that are candidate
species or are likely to become candidate species as determined by the
United States fish and wildlife service;

9 (b) Section 24-33-111 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes, the 10 executive director of the department of natural resources, after consulting 11 with the Colorado water conservation board and its director, the parks and 12 wildlife board, and the director of the division of parks and wildlife, has 13 prepared and delivered to the general assembly a species conservation 14 eligibility list describing programs and associated costs that are eligible 15 to receive funding from the species conservation trust fund; and

(c) Section 24-33-111 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes, prior to
obligating funds from the species conservation trust fund, the species
conservation eligibility list is subject to modification and adoption
through the passage of a bill.

SECTION 2. Eligibility list - approval. (1) The general
 assembly deems the recommended expenditures described in the species
 conservation eligibility list to be in the interest of the people of the state.
 The money specified in this subsection (1) is available in fiscal year

2015-16 and remains available for the designated purposes until it is fully
 expended. The executive director of the department of natural resources
 is authorized to obligate and expend five million dollars (\$5,000,000)
 from the species conservation trust fund for the following activities,
 programs, and species in the following amounts:
