### A BILL FOR AN ACT

### 101 CONCERNING MEASURES TO PREVENT ORGANIZED RETAIL THEFT.

### **Bill Summary**

If a person causes a fire or exit alarm to go off or deactivates an alarm, that conduct is an act of disorderly conduct and will be penalized as a class 2 misdemeanor. The definition of a "theft detection deactivating device" and "theft detection shielding device" are expanded.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	<b>SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.</b> (1) The general assembly
3	hereby finds and declares that:
4	(a) Organized retail theft is a growing criminal enterprise in this
5	state with evolving methods that not only cost business significant
6	revenue but also endanger Colorado citizens that are present during an act
7	of organized retail theft; and
8	(b) Over \$500 million in goods are stolen from Colorado
9	businesses every year, costing the state nearly \$15 million annually in
10	sales tax revenue.
11	(2) Therefore, it is necessary for the state to bolster the state
12	criminal laws associated with some of the methods used to commit
13	organized retail theft.
14	<b>SECTION 2.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-9-106, <b>amend</b> (1)
15	(f) and (3) (c); and <b>add</b> (1) (g) as follows:
16	<b>18-9-106. Disorderly conduct.</b> (1) A person commits disorderly
17	conduct if he or she intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly:
18	(f) Not being a peace officer, displays a deadly weapon, displays
19	any article used or fashioned in a manner to cause a person to reasonably
20	believe that the article is a deadly weapon, or represents verbally or
21	otherwise that he or she is armed with a deadly weapon in a public place
22	in a manner calculated to alarm; OR
23	(g) Causes a fire alarm or an exit alarm to sound or an
24	ALARM TO BE ACTIVATED OR DEACTIVATED OR PREVENTS A FIRE ALARM
25	FROM SOUNDING.
26	(3) (c) An offense under paragraph (e), or (f), OR (g) of subsection
27	(1) of this section is a class 2 misdemeanor.

1	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-4-417, amend (2)
2	(a) and (2) (c) as follows:
3	18-4-417. Unlawful acts - theft detection devices. (2) As used
4	in this section:
5	(a) "Theft detection deactivating device" means any tool,
6	instrument, mechanism, or other article adapted, designed, engineered,
7	used, or operated to inactivate, incapacitate, or remove a theft detection
8	device without authorization. "THEFT DETECTION DEACTIVATING DEVICE"
9	INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, JUMPER WIRES, WIRE CUTTERS, AND
10	ELECTRONIC ARTICLE SURVEILLANCE REMOVAL DEVICES.
11	(c) "Theft detection shielding device" means any tool, instrument,
12	mechanism, or article adapted, designed, engineered, used, or operated to
13	avoid detection by a theft detection device during the commission of an
14	offense involving theft. "Theft detection shielding device" includes, but
15	is not limited to, any laminated or coated sack or container that is capable
16	of avoiding detection by a theft detection device FOIL LINED OR
17	OTHERWISE MODIFIED CLOTHING, BAGS, PURSES, OR CONTAINERS CAPABLE
18	OF AND FOR THE SOLE PURPOSE OF AVOIDING DETECTION DEVICES.
19	SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
20	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
21	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
