A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF THE PALISADE PEACH AS THE 102 STATE FRUIT.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill designates the Palisade peach as the state fruit of Colorado.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly
2	hereby finds and declares that:
3	(a) The <i>prunus persica</i> (<i>L.</i>) <i>batsch</i> , more commonly known as the
4	peach, has been grown in and around Palisade, Colorado, since the 1880s;
5	(b) Colorado ranks sixth nationwide in peach production with over
6	five hundred twenty thousand peach trees in cultivation;
7	(c) In 2012, peach cultivation yielded receipts of over twenty-five
8	million dollars;
9	(d) Peach cultivation accounts for seventy-five percent of all fruit
10	production in Colorado, and seventy-five percent of all peach orchards in
11	Colorado are located in and around Palisade;
12	(e) Palisade is home to the Palisade peach festival, which hosted
13	fourteen thousand visitors in 2013.
14	(2) Therefore, the general assembly intends that the Palisade
15	peach be added to the array of symbols that demonstrate our state
16	character and pride.
17	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-80-915 as
18	follows:
19	24-80-915. State fruit. THE PALISADE PEACH (PRUNUS PERSICA
20	(L.) BATSCH) IS HEREBY MADE AND DECLARED TO BE THE STATE FRUIT OF
21	THE STATE OF COLORADO.
22	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
23	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
24	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
25	6, 2014, if adjournment sine die is on May 7, 2014); except that, if a
26	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
27	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
