A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING SUPPLEMENTAL PAYMENTS FOR HOSPICE PROVIDERS IN THE MEDICAID PROGRAM, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,

Bill Summary

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS.

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Joint Budget Committee. For the 2013-14 and 2014-15 fiscal years, the bill requires the department of health care policy and financing to make a supplemental payment to hospice providers in proportion to the hospice services provided. The medical services board shall adopt rules

concerning the payments. The provision repeals in 2015.

The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund for the provider payments.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25.5-5-304, add (5) 3 as follows: 4 25.5-5-304. Hospice care - supplemental provider payment -5 **rules - repeal.** (5) (a) FOR THE 2013-14 AND 2014-15 FISCAL YEARS, THE 6 STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL MAKE A SUPPLEMENTAL PAYMENT TO 7 PROVIDERS OF SERVICES PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION IN PROPORTION TO 8 THE HOSPICE SERVICES PROVIDED. THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT RULES 9 IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 24-4-103, C.R.S., CONCERNING THE 10 AMOUNT AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE SUPPLEMENTAL PAYMENTS. 11 (b) This subsection (5) is repealed, effective July 1, 2015. 12 **SECTION 2.** Appropriation. (1) In addition to any other 13 appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the 14 general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of health care 15 policy and financing, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the sum 16 of \$317,665, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to 17 medical services premiums for supplemental payments to providers of 18 hospice services related to the implementation of this act. 19 (2) The general assembly has determined that administrative costs 20 associated with implementing payments to hospice providers pursuant to 21 section 25.5-5-304 (5), Colorado Revised Statutes, can be implemented 22 within existing appropriations, and therefore no separate appropriation of 23 state moneys is necessary for administrative costs.

SECTION 3. Appropriation. (1) In addition to any other

appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of health care policy and financing, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of \$327,195, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to medical services premiums for supplemental payments to providers of hospice services related to the implementation of this act.

(2) The general assembly has determined that administrative costs associated with implementing payments to hospice providers pursuant to section 25.5-5-304 (5), Colorado Revised Statutes, can be implemented within existing appropriations, and therefore no separate appropriation of state moneys is necessary for administrative costs.

SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
