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**SECTION 2.** Section 6 of chapter 407, Session Laws of Colorado 2009, is amended to read:

Section 6. **Appropriation.** (1) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the division of registrations cash fund created in section 24-34-105 (20) (b) (I), Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of regulatory agencies, for allocation to the division of registrations, for the establishment of rules to ensure the competency of electricians, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, the sum of ninety-nine thousand eight hundred ninety-four dollars (\$99,894) ninety-six thousand one hundred thirty-nine dollars (\$96,139) cash funds and 1.0 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act.

(2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated to the department of law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, the sum of eleven thousand two hundred sixty-five dollars (\$11,265) SEVEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED TEN DOLLARS (\$7,510) and 0.1 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the provision of legal services to the department of regulatory agencies related to the implementation of this act. Said sum shall be from reappropriated funds received from the department of regulatory agencies out of the appropriation made in subsection (1) of this section.

**SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
