A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING PROHIBITING THE USE OF UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS
102 TO OBSTRUCT PUBLIC SAFETY OPERATIONS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill creates the new criminal offense of obstructing a peace officer, firefighter, emergency medical service provider, rescue specialist, or volunteer with an unmanned aircraft system. A person commits the offense when he or she operates an unmanned aircraft system in a manner that violates one or more safety requirements and obstructs, impairs, or hinders:

- ! A peace officer acting under color of his or her official authority;
- ! A firefighter acting under color of his or her official authority;
- ! An emergency medical service provider or rescue specialist acting under color of his or her official authority; or
- ! The administration of emergency care or emergency assistance by a volunteer, acting in good faith to render such care or assistance without compensation at the place of an emergency or accident.

Obstructing a peace officer, firefighter, emergency medical service provider, rescue specialist, or volunteer with an unmanned aircraft system is a class 2 misdemeanor.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly finds that, as the use of unmanned aircraft systems expands in Colorado, the possibility exists that operators of such systems may interfere with public safety operations and that such interference could create public safety concerns.

- (2) Now, therefore, it is the intent of the general assembly that:
- (a) Efforts should be undertaken to increase public awareness of the possible hazards of unmanned aircraft systems and to provide necessary tools to eliminate, to the extent possible, interference with public safety activities by operators of unmanned aircraft systems; and
- (b) When a public safety agency enters a scenario in which interference by unmanned aircraft systems would likely put public safety at risk:
 - (I) The agency should make its presence known; and
- (II) Operators of unmanned aircraft systems should follow applicable laws and regulations and comply with any instructions issued by public safety entities on the scene.

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1	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 18-8-104.5 as

6	definitions. (1) A PERSON COMMITS OBSTRUCTING A PEACE OFFICER,
7	FIREFIGHTER, EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDER, RESCUE
8	SPECIALIST, OR VOLUNTEER WITH AN UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM WHEN
9	HE OR SHE OPERATES AN UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM IN A MANNER
10	THAT:
11	(a) VIOLATES ONE OR MORE OF THE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS
12	DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION; AND
13	(b) OBSTRUCTS, IMPAIRS, OR HINDERS:
14	(I) A PEACE OFFICER ACTING UNDER COLOR OF HIS OR HER
15	OFFICIAL AUTHORITY;
16	(II) A FIREFIGHTER ACTING UNDER COLOR OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL
17	AUTHORITY;
18	(III) AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDER OR RESCUE
19	SPECIALIST ACTING UNDER COLOR OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL AUTHORITY; OR
20	(IV) THE ADMINISTRATION OF EMERGENCY CARE OR EMERGENCY
21	ASSISTANCE BY A VOLUNTEER, ACTING IN GOOD FAITH TO RENDER SUCH
22	CARE OR ASSISTANCE WITHOUT COMPENSATION AT THE PLACE OF AN
23	EMERGENCY OR ACCIDENT.
24	(2) A PERSON WHO OPERATES AN UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM:
25	(a) SHALL NOT INTERFERE WITH MANNED OR UNMANNED AIRCRAFT
26	OPERATIONS INVOLVED IN PUBLIC SAFETY OPERATIONS; AND
27	(b) SHALL NOT INTEREDE WITH CROLIND OPERATIONS INVOLVED

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1	IN PUBLIC SAFETY.
2	(3) It is not a defense to a prosecution under this section
3	THAT THE PEACE OFFICER WAS ACTING IN AN ILLEGAL MANNER, IF HE OR
4	SHE WAS ACTING UNDER COLOR OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL AUTHORITY. A
5	PEACE OFFICER ACTS "UNDER COLOR OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL AUTHORITY"
6	IF, IN THE REGULAR COURSE OF ASSIGNED DUTIES, HE OR SHE MAKES A
7	JUDGMENT IN GOOD FAITH BASED ON SURROUNDING FACTS AND
8	CIRCUMSTANCES THAT HE OR SHE MUST ACT TO ENFORCE THE LAW OR
9	PRESERVE THE PEACE.
10	(4) THE OFFENSE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION
11	DOES NOT APPLY IF THE PERSON WHO OPERATES THE UNMANNED AIRCRAFT
12	SYSTEM:
13	(a) OBTAINS PERMISSION TO OPERATE THE UNMANNED AIRCRAFT
14	SYSTEM FROM A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY OR OTHER ENTITY THAT IS
15	COORDINATING THE RESPONSE OF PEACE OFFICERS, FIREFIGHTERS, OR
16	EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDERS TO AN EMERGENCY OR
17	ACCIDENT;
18	(b) CONTINUES TO COMMUNICATE WITH SUCH ENTITY DURING THE
19	OPERATION OF THE UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM; AND
20	(c) COMPLIES IMMEDIATELY WITH ANY INSTRUCTIONS FROM THE
21	ENTITY CONCERNING THE OPERATION OF THE UNMANNED AIRCRAFT
22	SYSTEM.
23	(5) Obstructing a peace officer, firefighter, emergency
24	MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDER, RESCUE SPECIALIST, OR VOLUNTEER WITH AN
25	UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM IS A CLASS 2 MISDEMEANOR.
26	(6) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT
27	OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

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1	(a) "EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDER" MEANS A MEMBER
2	OF A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE AGENCY,
3	WHETHER THAT PERSON IS A VOLUNTEER OR RECEIVES COMPENSATION FOR
4	SERVICES RENDERED AS SUCH EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDER.
5	(b) "RESCUE SPECIALIST" MEANS A MEMBER OF A PUBLIC OR
6	PRIVATE RESCUE AGENCY, WHETHER THAT PERSON IS A VOLUNTEER OR
7	RECEIVES COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES RENDERED AS SUCH RESCUE
8	SPECIALIST.
9	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date -
10	applicability. (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following
11	the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the
12	general assembly (August 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9,
13	2018); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1
14	(3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section,
15	or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part
16	will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election
17	to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the
18	date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
19	(2) This act applies to offenses committed on or after the

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applicable effective date of this act.

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
