A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CLARIFYING THAT MONEY IN THE P.O.S.T. BOARD CASH
102 FUND MAY BE USED TO TRAIN MILITARY LAW ENFORCEMENT
103 PERSONNEL STATIONED IN COLORADO.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, money in the P.O.S.T. board cash fund can be used to provide training for peace officers. The bill clarifies that the money can also be used to train military law enforcement personnel stationed in Colorado.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-31-310, **amend**
3 (2) as follows:

4 **24-31-310. Resources for the training of peace officers - peace**
5 **officers in rural jurisdictions - legislative declaration.** (2) The ~~moneys~~
6 MONEY collected and transferred to the P.O.S.T. board cash fund pursuant
7 to section 42-3-304 (24) ~~C.R.S., shall~~ MUST be used to provide training
8 programs for COLORADO peace officers AND MILITARY LAW
9 ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL STATIONED IN COLORADO, especially peace
10 officers in rural and smaller jurisdictions that have limited resources due
11 to the size or location of such jurisdictions. The ~~moneys shall~~ MONEY
12 MUST be used and distributed pursuant to subsection (3) of this section.

13 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
14 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
15 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
16 9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10, 2017); except that, if a
17 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
18 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
19 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
20 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
21 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
22 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
