A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE GREEN JOBS COLORADO  
102 TRAINING PROGRAM IN THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR, AND, IN  
103 CONNECTION THEREWITH, CREATING THE GREEN JOBS  
104 COLORADO ADVISORY COUNCIL AND THE GREEN JOBS  
105 COLORADO TRAINING FUND, AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Colorado training program, which is a 2-year pilot program. The pilot program will offer grants to applicants who train individuals for jobs in the wind, solar, renewable energy, and energy efficiency industries.

The bill also creates the green jobs Colorado advisory council, which will review grant applications and award grants to applicants who meet the requirements specified in the bill.

The bill specifies that the pilot program is to be funded by federal funds received by the department of labor and employment for the purposes of the pilot program and by funds received from the governor's energy office.

Finally, the bill requires the executive director of the department of labor and employment to evaluate the green jobs Colorado training program and report his or her findings to the governor and the legislative committees of reference assigned in the bill.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** Title 24, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY  
3 THE ADDITION OF A NEW ARTICLE to read:

4 **ARTICLE 38.9**

5 **Green Jobs Colorado Training Program**

6 **24-38.9-101. Legislative declaration.** THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY  
7 FINDS, DETERMINES, AND DECLARES THAT AS COLORADO CONTINUES TO  
8 EXPAND ITS NEW ENERGY ECONOMY, THE STATE MUST ENSURE THAT  
9 COLORADO CITIZENS HAVE ACCESS TO THE NECESSARY SKILLS IN ORDER  
10 TO COMPETE FOR JOBS IN THE NEW ENERGY MARKET. THE GENERAL  
11 ASSEMBLY FURTHER FINDS, DETERMINES, AND DECLARES THAT A SKILLED  
12 WORKFORCE IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT DRIVERS IN DETERMINING  
13 THE FUTURE GLOBAL COMPETITIVENESS OF COLORADO. THEREFORE, THE  
14 GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS THAT THE PURPOSE OF THE GREEN JOBS  
15 COLORADO TRAINING PROGRAM IS TO MAINTAIN COLORADO'S  
16 COMPETITIVE ADVANTAGE AND ENSURE THAT FUTURE WORKFORCE SUPPLY  
17 CAN MEET THE ONCOMING DEMAND FOR GREEN JOB SKILLS IN THE NEW

1 ENERGY ECONOMY.

2 **24-38.9-102. Definitions.** AS USED IN THIS ARTICLE, UNLESS THE  
3 CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

4 (1) "APPLICANT" MEANS A REGIONAL, INDUSTRY-BASED  
5 PARTNERSHIP COMPRISED OF A LEAD APPLICANT, AN OFFICIAL FROM THE  
6 AFFECTED FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT REGION,  
7 AND REPRESENTATIVES FROM ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING GROUPS:

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9 (a) EMPLOYERS;

10 (b) EDUCATORS;

11 (c) TRAINING PROVIDERS;

12 (d) ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATIONS; [REDACTED]

17 COUNCIL CREATED IN SECTION 24-38.9-103.

18 (3) "GREEN JOBS" MEANS OCCUPATIONS OR EMPLOYMENT  
19 POSITIONS IN THE WIND, SOLAR, ENERGY EFFICIENCY, OR RENEWABLE  
20 ENERGY INDUSTRIES.

21 (4) "LEAD APPLICANT" MEANS A CERTIFIED TRAINING PROVIDER  
22 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO:

23 (a) A COMMUNITY OR JUNIOR COLLEGE; [REDACTED]

24 (b) AN AREA VOCATIONAL SCHOOL AS DEFINED IN SECTION  
25 23-60-103 (1), C.R.S., INCLUDING THE EMILY GRIFFITH OPPORTUNITY  
26 SCHOOL, THE DELTA-MONTROSE AREA VOCATIONAL SCHOOL, AND THE  
27 AURORA TECH CENTER;

1           (c) THE COLORADO YOUTH CORPS, THE COLORADO YOUTH CORPS  
2           ASSOCIATION, COLORADO YOUTH CONSERVATION CORPS, VETERANS  
3           GREEN JOBS, OR THEIR SUCCESSORS; OR

4           (d) AN APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM RECOGNIZED BY THE UNITED  
5           STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR OFFICE OF APPRENTICESHIP, OR ITS  
6           SUCCESSOR.

7           (5) "LEVEL ONE AND LEVEL TWO EVALUATIONS" MEAN THE FIRST  
8           TWO LEVELS OF THE DONALD KIRKPATRICK EVALUATION MODEL. LEVEL  
9           ONE AND LEVEL TWO INCLUDE:

10           (a) THE REACTION OF THE TRAINEE, INCLUDING WHAT THE TRAINEE  
11           THOUGHT AND FELT ABOUT THE TRAINING; AND

12           (b) AN ANALYSIS OF THE TRAINEE'S RESULTING INCREASE IN  
13           KNOWLEDGE OR CAPABILITY.

14           (6) "PILOT PROGRAM" MEANS THE GREEN JOBS COLORADO  
15           TRAINING PROGRAM CREATED IN SECTION 24-38.9-105.

16           **24-38.9-103. Green jobs Colorado advisory council - creation**  
17           **- appointments.** (1) THERE IS HEREBY CREATED IN THE OFFICE OF THE  
18           GOVERNOR THE GREEN JOBS COLORADO ADVISORY COUNCIL.

19           (2) THE COUNCIL SHALL CONSIST OF SEVENTEEN MEMBERS, SEVEN  
20           OF WHOM SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE  
21           DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT, WHO SHALL APPOINT AT LEAST  
22           ONE MEMBER FROM EACH OF THE FOLLOWING: A NONPROFIT  
23           ORGANIZATION, \_\_\_\_\_ A COMMUNITY OR JUNIOR COLLEGE, A CLEAN  
24           TECHNOLOGY INDUSTRY ASSOCIATION, A BUSINESS ORGANIZATION, AN  
25           INVESTOR-OWNED UTILITY, A RURAL ELECTRIC ASSOCIATION, AND A  
26           LABOR ORGANIZATION. THE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE  
27           DIRECTOR SHALL POSSESS RELEVANT EXPERIENCE RELATED TO GREEN JOBS

1 OR GREEN JOB TRAINING. FOUR LEGISLATIVE MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL  
2 SHALL BE APPOINTED AS FOLLOWS: ONE MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY  
3 THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, ONE MEMBER SHALL BE  
4 APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, ONE MEMBER SHALL BE  
5 APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE HOUSE OF  
6 REPRESENTATIVES, AND ONE MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE  
7 MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE. THE REMAINING SIX MEMBERS SHALL  
8 BE THE DIRECTOR OF THE GOVERNOR'S ENERGY OFFICE, THE DIRECTOR OF  
9 THE COLORADO OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, THE EXECUTIVE  
10 DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, THE EXECUTIVE  
11 DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS, THE CHAIR OF THE  
12 COLORADO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL OR ITS SUCCESSOR, AND  
13 THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND  
14 EMPLOYMENT, OR THEIR RESPECTIVE DESIGNEES.

15 (3) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND  
16 EMPLOYMENT SHALL APPOINT THE INITIAL NONLEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
17 MEMBERS AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION ON OR  
18 BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2010. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL APPOINT THE  
19 COUNCIL CHAIR AT THE TIME OF APPOINTMENT OF THE COUNCIL. THE  
20 NONLEGISLATIVE MEMBERS SHALL SERVE, AND THE TERMS OF THE  
21 COUNCIL MEMBERS SHALL EXPIRE, AT THE PLEASURE OF THE EXECUTIVE  
22 DIRECTOR. UPON THE EXPIRATION OF A NONLEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
23 MEMBER'S TERM, THE MEMBER SHALL CONTINUE TO SERVE UNTIL A  
24 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS  
25 SECTION.

26 (4) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND  
27 EMPLOYMENT SHALL APPOINT A QUALIFIED PERSON TO FILL A VACANCY ON

1 THE COUNCIL FOR THE REMAINDER OF ANY UNEXPIRED TERM OF A  
2 NONLEGISLATIVE MEMBER. IF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR DOES NOT  
3 APPOINT A PERSON TO FILL THE VACANCY WITHIN SIXTY DAYS AFTER THE  
4 DATE THE VACANCY OCCURS, THE COUNCIL, BY A MAJORITY VOTE, SHALL  
5 APPOINT A QUALIFIED PERSON TO FILL THE VACANCY.

6 (5) THE COUNCIL SHALL CONVENE ITS FIRST MEETING NO LATER  
7 THAN SEPTEMBER 1, 2010, AND SHALL MEET AT LEAST QUARTERLY  
8 THEREAFTER; EXCEPT THAT THE CHAIR, UPON PROVIDING ADEQUATE  
9 NOTICE, MAY CANCEL A MEETING IF THERE IS NO BUSINESS BEFORE THE  
10 COUNCIL. THE MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL SHALL ALSO BE HELD UPON  
11 CALL OF THE CHAIR OR AT THE REQUEST OF AT LEAST THREE MEMBERS OF  
12 THE COUNCIL.

13 (6) COUNCIL MEMBERS SHALL NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR  
14 THEIR TIME NOR SHALL THEY BE REIMBURSED FOR ACTUAL AND  
15 NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE DISCHARGE OF THEIR OFFICIAL  
16 DUTIES, INCLUDING AN ALLOWANCE FOR MILEAGE AS PROVIDED IN  
17 SECTION 24-9-104 (2) (d).

18 **24-38.9-104. Powers and duties of the council.** (1) THE  
19 COUNCIL SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING POWERS, FUNCTIONS, AND DUTIES:

20 (a) ADMINISTERING THE PILOT PROGRAM ESTABLISHED IN SECTION  
21 24-38.9-105;

22 (b) RECEIVING AND REVIEWING APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS FROM  
23 APPLICANTS;

24 (c) AWARDING GRANTS TO APPLICANTS WHO MEET THE CRITERIA  
25 SPECIFIED IN SECTION 24-38.9-105;

26 (d) ESTABLISHING REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANTS  
27 WHO ARE AWARDED GRANTS; AND

1 (e) DEVELOPING PROCEDURES RELATING TO THE COUNCIL'S  
2 INTERNAL OPERATIONS.

3 (2) (a) IN ADDITION TO THE POWERS, FUNCTIONS, AND DUTIES  
4 SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION, THE COUNCIL MAY  
5 COORDINATE THE ACTIVITIES OF ANY STATE DEPARTMENT, OFFICE, OR  
6 AGENCY IN SO FAR AS THOSE ACTIVITIES RELATE TO GREEN JOBS. THE  
7 COUNCIL MAY ALSO ACCUMULATE DATA RELATING TO SUCH ACTIVITIES  
8 FOR THE PURPOSE OF COORDINATION AND EFFICIENCY.

9 (b) UPON COMPLETION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM, THE COLORADO  
10 WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL OR ITS SUCCESSOR SHALL CARRY  
11 OUT THE COORDINATION POWERS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS  
12 SUBSECTION (2).

13 **24-38.9-105. Green jobs Colorado training program - creation**  
14 **- grants - training - priority.** (1) THE GREEN JOBS COLORADO TRAINING  
15 PROGRAM IS HEREBY CREATED. THE PILOT PROGRAM SHALL OFFER  
16 GRANTS TO APPLICANTS THAT FOCUS ON DEVELOPING TRAINING  
17 PROGRAMS, STRATEGIES, AND CURRICULA FOR OCCUPATIONS IN THE WIND,  
18 SOLAR, ENERGY EFFICIENCY, AND RENEWABLE ENERGY INDUSTRIES.  
19 GRANTS AWARDED TO APPLICANTS SHALL BE USED FOR EITHER THE  
20 DEVELOPMENT OF A NEW PROGRAM OR THE IMPLEMENTATION OR  
21 EXPANSION OF AN EXISTING PROGRAM. GRANTS AWARDED TO APPLICANTS  
22 MAY ALSO BE USED TO COMPLEMENT ANY EXISTING GREEN JOBS TRAINING  
23 INITIATIVES EXPERIENCING A SHORTFALL IN RESOURCES. THE PILOT  
24 PROGRAM SHALL BE SUBJECT TO REVIEW AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION  
25 24-38.9-107.

26 (2) APPLICANTS FOR GRANTS SHALL SUBMIT APPLICATIONS TO THE  
27 COUNCIL. SUBMITTED APPLICATIONS SHALL:

1 (a) SEEK TO PROVIDE AT LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING TRAINING  
2 METHODS:

3 (I) CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS THAT MEET INDUSTRY-RECOGNIZED  
4 STANDARDS, AS DETERMINED BY THE COUNCIL, IN THE WIND, SOLAR,  
5 ENERGY EFFICIENCY, OR RENEWABLE ENERGY INDUSTRIES;

6 (II) ON-THE-JOB TRAINING PROGRAMS THAT COMBINE WORKPLACE  
7 TRAINING WITH RELATED INSTRUCTION BY PERSONS QUALIFIED OR  
8 LICENSED IN THE FIELD OR TRADE. SUCH TRAINING MAY INCLUDE PAID  
9 COOPERATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS.

10 (III) SKILL UPGRADING OR RETRAINING, WITH A COMMITMENT BY  
11 AN EMPLOYER OR GROUP OF EMPLOYERS TO EMPLOY A QUALIFIED  
12 INDIVIDUAL WHO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES THE TRAINING;

13 (IV) EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING PROGRAMS THAT ARE  
14 ACCREDITED BY THE COLORADO YOUTH CORPS ASSOCIATION OR ITS  
15 SUCCESSOR SUCH AS THE COLORADO YOUTH CORPS.

16 (b) SEEK TO CREATE OR EXPAND PROGRAMS THAT MEET STATE- OR  
17 NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED INDUSTRY STANDARDS;

18 (c) ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH ANY REPORTING REQUIREMENTS  
19 ESTABLISHED BY THE COUNCIL; AND

20 (d) ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH COMPETENCY STANDARDS  
21 PURSUANT TO STATE LAW.

22 (3) THE COUNCIL SHALL GIVE PRIORITY TO APPLICATIONS THAT:

23 (a) DEMONSTRATE THE HIGH LIKELIHOOD OF JOB OFFERS TO  
24 INDIVIDUALS THAT COMPLETE A TRAINING PROGRAM; AND

25 (b) FOCUS ON CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS OR CURRICULA THAT  
26 TARGET LOW-INCOME ADULTS AND YOUTH, ENTRY-LEVEL OR INCUMBENT  
27 WORKERS, AND DISLOCATED WORKERS IN DECLINING INDUSTRIES.



1 (4) IN ADDITION TO MEETING THE APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS  
2 SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION, ALL APPLICANTS SHALL  
3 PLEDGE TO PROVIDE AT LEAST TWENTY PERCENT OF THE OVERALL COSTS  
4 OF A TRAINING PROGRAM, FIFTY PERCENT OF WHICH MAY BE USED FOR ANY  
5 ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS OR OTHER INDIRECT COSTS OF THE TRAINING  
6 PROGRAM. ANY FEDERAL MONEYS RECEIVED BY THE STATE AND  
7 AWARDED TO AN APPLICANT PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE USED  
8 ONLY FOR DIRECT TRAINING PROGRAM COSTS.

9 **24-38.9-106. Funding.** THE PILOT PROGRAM MAY BE FUNDED BY  
10 THE USE OF FEDERAL MONEYS RECEIVED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR  
11 AND EMPLOYMENT FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE PILOT PROGRAM AND BY THE  
12 USE OF MONEYS FROM THE GOVERNOR'S ENERGY OFFICE.

13 **24-38.9-107. Review of program - report to governor and**  
14 **legislature.** (1) UPON COMPLETION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM, THE  
15 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT  
16 SHALL CONDUCT AN EVALUATION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM AND SHALL  
17 REPORT THE FINDINGS TO THE GOVERNOR, THE BUSINESS AFFAIRS AND  
18 LABOR COMMITTEE IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND THE  
19 BUSINESS, LABOR, AND TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE IN THE SENATE, OR ANY  
20 SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES. FOR PURPOSES OF THE REPORT TO THE  
21 LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEES, THE BUSINESS AFFAIRS AND LABOR COMMITTEE  
22 IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE BUSINESS, LABOR AND  
23 TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE IN THE SENATE MAY HOLD A JOINT HEARING.

24 (2) THE REPORT REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION  
25 SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

- 26 (a) THE NAME AND GEOGRAPHICAL AREA OF GRANT RECIPIENTS;
- 27 (b) THE AMOUNT OF GRANT MONEYS DISTRIBUTED TO EACH

1 ENTITY;

2 (c) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS WHO RECEIVED OR ARE  
3 RECEIVING TRAINING SERVICES UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM;

4 (d) THE DEMOGRAPHICS, AS AVAILABLE, OF THE INDIVIDUALS WHO  
5 RECEIVED OR ARE RECEIVING TRAINING SERVICES UNDER THE PILOT  
6 PROGRAM;

7 (e) THE TYPE OF TRAINING SERVICES PROVIDED;

8 (f) THE NAME OF THE SPECIFIC ORGANIZATION PROVIDING THE  
9 TRAINING;

10 (g) LEVEL ONE AND LEVEL TWO EVALUATIONS AS DEFINED IN  
11 SECTION 24-38.9-102 (5);

12 (h) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS PLACED IN FULL-TIME  
13 EMPLOYMENT AS A RESULT OF THE TRAINING AND THE LENGTH OF TIME  
14 THAT THEY HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED IN A GREEN JOB; AND

15 (i) ANY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PILOT PROGRAM IMPROVEMENT  
16 SUGGESTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR  
17 AND EMPLOYMENT.

18 (3) THE GOVERNOR, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE LEGISLATIVE  
19 COMMITTEES SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION, SHALL  
20 REVIEW THE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE REPORT REQUIRED  
21 BY SAID SUBSECTION (1) TO DETERMINE THE OVERALL EFFECTIVENESS OF  
22 THE PILOT PROGRAM. OVERALL EFFECTIVENESS SHALL BE BASED, AT A  
23 MINIMUM, ON REGIONAL IMPACT, THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS TRAINED  
24 AND PLACED INTO EMPLOYMENT, AND THE LENGTH OF TIME EACH  
25 INDIVIDUAL WAS EMPLOYED IN A GREEN JOB.

26 **24-38.9-108. Repeal of article.** THIS ARTICLE IS REPEALED,  
27 EFFECTIVE JUNE 30, 2012.

1           **SECTION 2. Appropriation - adjustments to the 2010 long**  
2 **bill.** (1) The general assembly anticipates that, for the fiscal year  
3 beginning July 1, 2010, the department of governor-lieutenant  
4 governor-state planning and budgeting, office of the governor, governor's  
5 energy office, will receive the sum of one hundred thousand dollars  
6 (\$100,000) in federal funds for the implementation of this act. Said sum  
7 shall be from funds received through the American Recovery and  
8 Reinvestment Act of 2009. Although these funds are not appropriated in  
9 this act, they are noted for the purpose of indicating the assumptions used  
10 relative to these funds.

11           (2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby  
12 appropriated to the department of labor and employment, division of  
13 employment and training, employment and training programs, workforce  
14 investment act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, the sum of one  
15 hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or so much thereof as may be  
16 necessary, for the implementation of this act. Said sum shall be from  
17 reappropriated funds received from the department governor-lieutenant  
18 governor-state planning and budgeting of out of the appropriation made  
19 in subsection (1) of this section.

20           (3) For the implementation of this act, the federal funds  
21 appropriation made in the annual general appropriation act for the fiscal  
22 year beginning July 1, 2010, to the department of labor and employment,  
23 division of employment and training, employment and training programs,  
24 for workforce investment act, is increased by 1.4 FTE.

25           **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
26 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
27 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
