101	CONCERNING MODIFICATION OF THE MANNER IN WHICH SPECIFIED
102	MOTOR VEHICLE-RELATED FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
103	REVENUE ARE FUNDED, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,
104	MAKING AND REDUCING APPROPRIATIONS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Joint Budget Committee. The bill modifies the manner in which specified motor vehicle-related functions of the department of revenue (department) are funded by:

- Repealing annual statutory transfers from the marijuana tax cash fund to the licensing services cash fund for use by the hearings division and the division of motor vehicles in the department;
- Reducing the total amount appropriated to the hearing division and the division of motor vehicles that previously would have been funded with the marijuana tax cash fund transfers to the licensing services cash fund by 10%, and requiring such funding to be provided from "off the top" highways users tax fund (HUTF) appropriations rather than by licensing services cash fund appropriations through a statutory authorization for that use of "off the top" HUTF money and the following appropriations:
 - A decrease of \$713,000 in the 2022-23 long bill cash funds appropriation from the licensing services cash fund for personal services in the hearings division;
 - A decrease of \$548,000 in the 2022-23 long bill cash funds appropriation from the licensing services cash fund for Colorado driver's license, record, identification, and vehicle enterprise solution (DRIVES) maintenance and support in the division of motor vehicles; and
 - A 2022-23 state fiscal year "off the top" HUTF appropriation of \$1,261,000 to the department, which may use \$713,000 of the appropriation for personal services in the hearings division and \$548,000 of the appropriation for DRIVES maintenance and support in the division of motor vehicles.
- 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
- 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 39-28.8-501, **repeal**
- 3 (7)(a) as follows:
- 4 39-28.8-501. Marijuana tax cash fund creation distribution
- 5 legislative declaration repeal. (7) (a) On July 1, 2022, and on July 1
- of each year thereafter, the state treasurer shall make the following

(3) (a) (I) The 9 general assembly shall not make any annual appropriation (whether by 10 regular, special, or supplementary appropriation) or any statutory 11 distribution from the highway users tax fund for any purpose or purposes 12 in a total amount that is: 13 (C) Commencing in the fiscal year 2013-14, more than a six 14 percent increase over the appropriation to the Colorado state patrol for the 15 prior fiscal year, plus, for the fiscal years 2016-17, 2017-18, and 2018-19, 16 only AND 2022-23 AND EACH SUCCEEDING FISCAL YEAR, the amount 17 appropriated to the department of revenue for use by the division of motor 18 vehicles pursuant to sub-subparagraph (C) of subparagraph (III) of this 19 paragraph (a) SUBSECTION (3)(a)(III)(C) OF THIS SECTION. 20 The general assembly shall not make any annual 21 appropriation or statutory distribution from the highway users tax fund for 22 the fiscal year 1997-98 or for any succeeding fiscal year authorized by 23 subparagraph (II) of this paragraph (a) SUBSECTION (3)(a)(II) OF THIS 24 SECTION, excluding the annual appropriation or statutory distribution to 25 the Colorado state patrol and, through the fiscal year 2011-12 only, the 26 ports of entry section and excluding any appropriation to the department

5	SECTION 3. Appropriation - adjustments to 2022 long bill
6	(1) To implement this act, appropriations made in the annual general
7	appropriation act for the 2022-23 state fiscal year to the department of
8	revenue are adjusted as follows:
9	(a) The cash funds appropriation from the licensing services cash
10	fund created in section 42-2-114.5 (1), C.R.S., for personal services in the
11	hearings division is decreased by \$713,000; and
12	(b) The cash funds appropriation from the licensing services cash
13	fund created in section 42-2-114.5 (1), C.R.S., for DRIVES maintenance
14	and support in the division of motor vehicles is decreased by \$548,000.
15	(2) For the 2022-23 state fiscal year, \$1,261,000 is appropriated
16	to the department of revenue. This appropriation is from the highway
17	users tax fund created in section 43-4-201 (1)(a), C.R.S., and is
18	appropriated pursuant to section 43-4-201 (3)(a)(I)(C), C.R.S. The
19	department may use this appropriation as follows:
20	(a) \$548,000 for DRIVES maintenance and support in the division
21	of motor vehicles; and
22	(b) \$713,000 for use by the hearings division for personal
23	services.
24	SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds
25	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
26	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
