#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### 101 CONCERNING THE SPECIES CONSERVATION TRUST FUND.

## **Bill Summary**

The bill appropriates money from the species conservation trust fund (trust fund) for programs submitted by the executive director of the department of natural resources that are designed to conserve native species that have been listed as threatened or endangered under state or federal law, or are candidate species or are likely to become candidate species as determined by the United States fish and wildlife service.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) Pursuant to: 3 (a) Section 24-33-111 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes, the species 4 conservation trust fund has been created in the state treasury to fund 5 programs designed to conserve native species that have been listed as 6 threatened or endangered under state or federal law, or are candidate 7 species or are likely to become candidate species as determined by the 8 United States fish and wildlife service: 9 Section 24-33-111 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes, the 10 executive director of the department of natural resources, after consulting 11 with the Colorado water conservation board and its director, the parks and 12 wildlife board, and the director of the division of parks and wildlife, has 13 prepared and delivered to the general assembly a species conservation 14 eligibility list describing programs and associated costs that are eligible 15 to receive funding from the species conservation trust fund; and 16 (c) Section 24-33-111 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes, prior to 17 obligating funds from the species conservation trust fund, the species 18 conservation eligibility list is subject to modification and adoption 19 through the passage of a bill. 20 **SECTION 2.** Eligibility list - approval. (1) The general 21 assembly deems the recommended expenditures described in the species 22 conservation eligibility list to be in the interest of the people of the state. 23 The moneys specified in this subsection (1) shall be available in fiscal 24 year 2012-13 and shall remain available for the designated purposes until 25 they are fully expended:

24	created in the state treasury the species conservation trust fund, which		
25	shall be IS subject to annual authorization by the general assembly to carry

27	conservation trust fund The State treasurer shall transfer all		
28	REVENUES PREVIOUSLY ALLOCATED TO the operation and maintenance		

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1	account and the capital account, The moneys in the operation and			
2	maintenance account shall be for administrative and noncapital			
3	expenditures necessary for the implementation of this section. The			
4	moneys in the capital account shall be used exclusively for capital			
5	expenditures including but not limited to property acquisition and project			
6	construction AS SUCH ACCOUNTS EXISTED BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF			
7	THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (I), AS AMENDED, TO THE FUND. All income derived			
8	from the deposit and investment of moneys in the fund shall be credited			
9	to the fund. At the end of any fiscal year, all unexpended moneys in the			
10	fund shall remain therein IN THE FUND and shall not be credited or			
11	transferred to the general fund or any other fund. To the maximum extent			
12	practical, only interest from the fund shall be expended for activities			
13	pursuant to this section.
