A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING RESTRICTIONS ON PERSONS LICENSED UNDER THE

"COLORADO LIQUOR CODE" TO SELL ALCOHOL BEVERAGES IN

SEALED CONTAINERS FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION, AND, IN

CONNECTION THEREWITH, PROHIBITING PERSONS UNDER

TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE FROM ENTERING A LICENSED

PREMISES UNLESS ACCOMPANIED BY A PERSON WHO IS AT LEAST

TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE.

Bill Summary

The bill makes it unlawful for a person licensed to sell alcohol beverages at retail for off-premises consumption to allow a person under 21 years of age to enter the licensed premises unless the person is accompanied by a person who is at least 21 years of age.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-47-901, add (5)
3	(p) as follows:
4	12-47-901. Unlawful acts - exceptions. (5) It is unlawful for any
5	person licensed to sell at retail pursuant to this article:
6	$\left(p\right) \left(I\right) To allow a person under twenty-one years of age to$
7	ENTER OR BE PRESENT ON THE LICENSED PREMISES UNLESS THE PERSON
8	UNDER TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE IS ACCOMPANIED BY A PERSON WHO
9	IS AT LEAST TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE.
10	(II) THIS PARAGRAPH (p) DOES NOT APPLY TO A PERSON LICENSEE
11	TO SELL ALCOHOL BEVERAGES FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE LICENSED
12	PREMISES.
13	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
