101 **CONCERNING CLARIFYING CHANGES TO THE PROSECUTION**
102 **FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Last session, a prosecution fellowship program was created to place law school graduate fellows in rural district attorneys' offices. The bill clarifies that the fellows are contract employees of the Colorado district attorneys' council and clarifies that up to 6 district attorneys' offices may be selected per year for the placement of fellows.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-19.3-102, **amend**
3 (1) (b) and (2) (e) as follows:

4 **23-19.3-102. Prosecution fellowship program - creation -**
5 **committee - administration - conditions.** (1) (b) The program will
6 match law school graduates for one-year fellowships with rural district
7 attorneys' offices throughout Colorado. The initial fellowships will be
8 awarded in fiscal year 2015-16. The program may fund the salary and
9 benefits for up to six fellows each year. The fellows are INDEPENDENT
10 CONTRACTORS AND NOT employees of the Colorado district attorneys'
11 council. The program is limited to law school graduates from the
12 university of Colorado school of law and the university of Denver Sturm
13 college of law. Each law school shall contribute an equal amount toward
14 twenty percent of the cost of the fellowship salaries if the school wants
15 its students to be considered for the fellowship program.

16 (2) (e) The committee shall review applications received by the
17 program, select up to six fellows for the particular fiscal year plus any
18 back-up candidates as determined necessary by the committee, and select
19 up to six district attorneys' office locations FOR PLACEMENT OF FELLOWS
20 EACH YEAR. After selecting the fellows and the district attorneys' office
21 locations, the committee shall match the fellows with a particular district
22 attorney's office.

23 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
24 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
25 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
