A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING REMOVAL OF UNAUTHORIZED PERSONS FROM VACANT

102 LAND.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Current law provides a procedure, in lieu of an eviction, to remove unauthorized persons from residential property. The bill expands the alternative procedure to authorize removal of unauthorized persons from vacant land.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 13-40.1-101, amend
3	(1)(b)(I), (2) , $(4)(b)(I)$, $(4)(b)(III)$, $(4)(c)$, $(5)(b)$, and $(5)(c)$; and add
4	(1)(c) as follows:
5	13-40.1-101. Removal of unauthorized persons - definitions.
6	(1) As used in this article 40.1, unless the context otherwise requires:
7	(b) (I) "Unauthorized person" means a person who occupies an
8	uninhabited or vacant residential premises, OR VACANT LAND, without any
9	current or prior agreement or consent of the owner or an authorized agent
10	of the owner, whether written or oral, concerning the use of the
11	residential premises OR VACANT LAND.
12	(c) "VACANT LAND" MEANS ANY LOT, PARCEL, SITE, OR TRACT OF
13	LAND UPON WHICH NO BUILDINGS OR FIXTURES, OTHER THAN MINOR
14	STRUCTURES, ARE LOCATED; OR THE VACANT PORTION OF A LOT, SITE, OR
15	TRACT ON WHICH A RESIDENTIAL PREMISES IS LOCATED.
16	(2) The owner of a residential premises OR VACANT LAND, or his
17	or her authorized agent, may initiate the investigation of and request the
18	removal of an unauthorized person or persons from the residential
19	premises OR VACANT LAND by filing with the county court a complaint
20	and a verified motion for a temporary mandatory injunction restoring
21	possession of the residential property PREMISES OR VACANT LAND to the
22	owner or lawful occupant. To the extent known or reasonably
23	ascertainable, the verified motion must identify the unauthorized person
24	or persons and include statements substantially as follows:
25	VERIFIED MOTION FOR ORDER TO
26	REMOVE UNAUTHORIZED PERSONS
27	The undersigned owner, or authorized agent of the

owner, of the residential premises OR VACANT LAND located
at requests that the court hold a hearing within one
court day and that the court enter a temporary mandatory
injunction and issue a writ of restitution ordering that the
person or persons currently occupying the residential
premises OR VACANT LAND be removed from the premises
OR LAND and be ordered not to return to the premises OR
LAND for a period of fourteen days. In support of the
request, the undersigned owner or authorized agent hereby
represents and declares under the penalty of perjury that
(initial each box):
1. [] The declarant is the owner of the premises OR LAND
or the authorized agent of the owner of the premises OR
LAND;
2. [] An unauthorized person or persons have entered and
are remaining unlawfully on the premises OR LAND;
3. [] Neither the owner nor an authorized agent of the
owner has ever given permission for the unauthorized
person or persons to enter and remain on the premises OR
LAND;
4. [] Neither the owner nor an authorized agent of the
owner has ever had a written or oral agreement with the
unauthorized person or persons regarding the use of the
premises OR LAND;
5. [] Neither the owner nor an authorized agent of the
owner is related to the unauthorized person or persons;
6. [] Neither the owner nor an authorized agent of the

1	owner has ever accepted money or anything of value from
2	the unauthorized person or persons regarding the use of the
3	premises OR LAND;
4	7. [] The declarant has demanded that the unauthorized
5	person or persons vacate the premises OR LAND but they
6	have not done so;
7	8. [] The declarant has informed the unauthorized person
8	or persons that he or she is going to court to request a
9	temporary mandatory injunction restoring the owner to
10	possession and shall deliver a copy of this Verified Motion
11	for Order to Remove Unauthorized Persons Form to the
12	unauthorized person or persons;
13	9. [] Additional optional explanatory comments or
14	statement that the premises has been altered or damaged:
15	
16	(4) (b) (I) The summons, complaint, motion, and notice required
17	by subsection (4)(b)(III) of this section shall MUST either be served by
18	personal service upon the defendant, as in any civil action, by a person
19	qualified under the Colorado rules of county court civil procedure to
20	serve process, or such person may make service by posting a copy of the
21	summons, complaint, motion, and notice required by subsection
22	(4)(b)(III) of this section in some conspicuous place upon the
23	RESIDENTIAL premises OR VACANT LAND.
24	(III) The written notice of the date, time, and location of the
25	hearing must be served with the complaint. The notice must be printed in
26	black ink and have a font size of not less than twelve and in substantially
27	the following form:

NOTICE
NOTICE

On [date], [year], at [time] in Courtroom [number],
[courthouse name], [courthouse address], the Court will
hold a hearing on a Motion for an Order for Temporary
Mandatory Injunction and writ of restitution in order to
require the removal from the residential premises OR
VACANT LAND located at [residential premises address OR
VACANT LAND ADDRESS] of each unauthorized person
identified in the motion that accompanies this notice. If you
are identified as an unauthorized person and if you believe
that is not true, then you must attend the hearing and
present any evidence supporting your position. IF YOU
FAIL TO ATTEND THE HEARING, THE COURT
MAY ENTER AN ORDER INSTRUCTING THE
SHERIFF TO REMOVE YOU FROM THE
RESIDENTIAL PREMISES OR VACANT LAND
IMMEDIATELY.

(c) Any occupant of the residential premises OR VACANT LAND who disputes that he or she is an unauthorized person may appear at the hearing and must be permitted to provide testimony and other evidence that the occupant is not an unauthorized person. The court, in its discretion, may accept a written statement submitted to the court prior to the commencement of the hearing in lieu of personal testimony from the occupant.

(5) (b) No later than twenty-four hours after receipt of order for temporary mandatory injunction, a sheriff, undersheriff, or deputy sheriff, as described in section 16-2.5-103 (1) or (2), while off duty or on duty at

1	rates charged by the employing sheriff's office in accordance with section
2	30-1-104 (1)(gg), shall:
3	(I) Remove the person or persons from the residential premises OR
4	VACANT LAND, with or without arresting the person or persons; and
5	(II) Order the person or persons to remain off the residential
6	premises OR VACANT LAND or be subject to arrest for criminal trespass.
7	(c) If the motion filed with the county court includes a statement
8	that the PREMISES OR property has been altered or damaged or the sheriff,
9	undersheriff, or deputy sheriff sees evidence that the PREMISES OR
10	property has been altered or damaged, the sheriff, undersheriff, or deputy
11	sheriff shall collect personal information from the person or persons and
12	shall provide that information to the declarant.
13	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 13-21-130 as
14	follows:
15	13-21-130. Civil liability for false statement to recover
16	possession of real property. In addition to any other remedies, a person
17	removed from a residential premises OR VACANT LAND pursuant to section
18	13-40.1-101 on the basis of false statements made by a declarant has a
19	private cause of action against the declarant. In the action, the plaintiff is
20	entitled to actual damages, attorney fees, and costs.
21	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 13-40.1-102, amend
22	(1) as follows:
23	13-40.1-102. Unauthorized alteration or damage of a
24	residential property. (1) If a person's conduct satisfies all of the
25	elements of section 18-4-501, the person who is removed from a
26	residential property PREMISES OR VACANT LAND pursuant to section
27	13-40.1-101 and who knowingly damages the real or personal property

of one or more other persons may have committed criminal mischief.

SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date - applicability. (1) This act takes effect September 1, 2019; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

(2) This act applies to requests for removal and offenses committed on or after the applicable effective date of this act.
