A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING PROTECTIONS FOR YOUTH IN FOSTER CARE AGAINST
102	IDENTITY THEFT, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN
103	APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

The bill amends the statute for protection of youth in foster care against identity theft by:

Removing the exclusion of youth who are in the custody of the division of youth corrections or a state mental hospital; SENATE rd Reading Unamended April 12, 2013

SENATE Amended 2nd Reading April 10, 2013

- ! Expanding the ages of the youth covered to any youth who is 16 years of age or older and in foster care; and
- ! Requiring the department of human services to obtain annual credit reports rather than a single report.

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 19-7-102, **amend** (1) and (2) (a) as follows:

19-7-102. Protection against identity theft. (1) The court shall ensure that each youth in foster care excluding youth in the custody of the division of youth corrections or a state mental hospital WHO IS IN THE LEGAL CUSTODY OF A COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN OR SOCIAL SERVICES OR THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AND Who is AT LEAST sixteen through eighteen years of age obtains OR RECEIVES a free ANNUAL credit report reports from the department of human services or a COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN OR SOCIAL SERVICES. THE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN OR __ SOCIAL SERVICES OR THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES SHALL INFORM THE COURT WITH JURISDICTION OVER THE YOUTH, IF ANY, OF ANY INACCURACIES IN A REPORT AND REFER THE MATTER TO A GOVERNMENTAL OR NONPROFIT ENTITY ON THE REFERRAL LIST DEVELOPED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION FOR ASSISTANCE IN INTERPRETING AND RESOLVING ANY INACCURACIES IN A REPORT if the credit report shows evidence of possible identity theft. the person assisting the youth shall inform the court and refer the matter to a governmental or nonprofit entity on the referral list developed pursuant to subsection (2) of this section for remedial action. The child's guardian ad litem shall advise the youth of possible consequences of and options to address the possible identity theft, including the right to report the

2	(2) (a) On or before July 31, 2012, the department of human
3	services shall develop, in consultation with county departments of HUMAN
4	OR social services, a referral list of governmental and nonprofit entities
5	that are authorized to assist a youth in foster care excluding a youth in the
6	custody of the division of youth corrections or a state mental hospital
7	who has found evidence of possible identity theft on his or her credit
8	report. An entity on the referral list developed pursuant to this subsection
9	(2) is authorized to take any necessary remedial actions to clear the
10	youth's credit record and shall report the results of its actions to the
11	county department of HUMAN OR social services with legal custody of the
12	<u>youth.</u>
13	SECTION 2. Appropriation. (1) In addition to any other
14	appropriation, there is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the
15	general fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of human
16	services, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the sum of \$24,334
17	or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act
18	as follows:
19	(a) \$19,650 to the division of child welfare for credit report
20	remediation; and
21	(b) \$4,684 to the division of youth corrections for credit report
22	remediation.
23	(2) (a) In addition to said appropriation, the general assembly
24	anticipates that, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the department
25	of human services will receive the sum of \$6,766 in federal funds for the
26	implementation of this act as follows:
27	(I) \$6,550 to the division of child welfare for credit report

2	(II) \$216 to the division of youth corrections for credit report
3	remediation.
4	(b) Although the federal funds identified in paragraph (a) of this
5	subsection (2) are not appropriated in this act, they are noted for the
6	purpose of indicating the assumptions used relative to these funds in
7	developing the state appropriation amounts.
8	SECTION <u>3.</u> Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds
9	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
10	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
