Bill Summary

The bill eliminates the requirement that the department of education administer a state assessment in social studies to elementary and secondary students.

SENATE 3rd Reading Unamended February 28, 2023

SENATE Amended 2nd Reading

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. The general assembly declares that eliminating the requirement that the Colorado department of education administer a state assessment in social studies neither eliminates education standards for instructional areas related to social studies nor eliminates the value or significance of social studies.

SECTION <u>2.</u> In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1006.3, **amend** (1)(a) introductory portion; and **repeal** (1)(a)(III) as follows:

22-7-1006.3. State assessments - administration - rules.

(1) (a) Beginning in the 2015-16 school year, the department of education, in collaboration with local education providers, shall administer the state assessments in the instructional areas of English language arts, mathematics, AND science, and social studies, as adopted by the state board pursuant to section 22-7-1006, as follows:

(III) The department shall administer a state assessment in social studies to students enrolled in public elementary and middle schools throughout the state. The department shall select the specific grades in which to administer the state social studies assessment, ensuring that students take the state social studies assessment once in elementary school and once in middle school. The department shall administer the social studies assessment required by this subsection (1)(a)(III) in a representative sample of public schools each school year, ensuring that it administers the social studies assessment in each public school at least once every three years. A school district, for one or more of the schools of the school district that are not included in the representative sample, or a charter school that is not included in the representative sample, may
