A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME AS THE STANDARD YEAR-ROUND 102 TIME WITHIN THE STATE.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law identifies United States Mountain Standard Time (MST) as the standard time in Colorado, except during the annual period of "daylight saving time" (the second Sunday in March through the first Sunday in November), during which MST is advanced one hour. The bill makes daylight saving time the year-round standard time within the state.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-4-109, amend (2);
3	and repeal (1) as follows:
4	2-4-109. Daylight saving time is year-round standard time.
5	(1) The standard time within the state except as provided in subsection
6	(2) of this section, is that which is now known and designated by act of
7	congress as "United States Mountain Standard Time".
8	(2) From two o'clock antemeridian on the second Sunday of
9	March, until two o'clock antemeridian on the first Sunday of November,
10	or such other times and days as may, from time to time, be designated by
11	act of congress, The standard time in this state so established shall be IS
12	one hour in advance of LATER THAN the standard time now known AND
13	DESIGNATED BY ACT OF CONGRESS as "United States Mountain Standard
14	Time", NOTWITHSTANDING HOW THAT TIME IS ADVANCED PURSUANT TO
15	15 U.S.C. SEC. 260a.
16	SECTION 2. Effective date. This act takes effect March 8, 2015.
17	SECTION 3. Refer to people under referendum. This act shall
18	be submitted to a vote of the registered electors of the state of Colorado
19	at the next biennial regular general election, for their approval or
20	rejection, under the provisions of the referendum as provided for in
21	section 1 of article V of the state constitution, and in article 40 of title 1,
22	Colorado Revised Statutes. Each elector voting at said election and
23	desirous of voting for or against said act shall cast a vote as provided by
24	law either "Yes" or "No" on the proposition: "SHALL THE STATE OF
25	COLORADO AMEND THE COLORADO REVISED STATUTES TO DECLARE THAT
26	DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME IS THE STANDARD TIME WITHIN THE STATE,
