CONCERNING STUDENT ADMISSION TO COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - GLOBAL CAMPUS.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

**SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-31.3-101, **amend** (1)(a) as follows:

**23-31.3-101.** University established - role and mission. (1) (a) There is hereby established an online university to be known as Colorado state university - global campus, referred to in this article ARTICLE 31.3 as "CSU global campus". CSU global campus is a baccalaureate and graduate online university with the mission in Colorado of offering baccalaureate degree programs for nontraditional students in partnership with the Colorado community college system and selected master-level

graduate programs. For baccalaureate degree students residing in Colorado, CSU global campus shall have moderately selective admission standards. CSU global campus shall not admit first-time freshman baccalaureate students who reside in Colorado and who are under twenty-three years of age. CSU global campus shall comply with all applicable statutes and rules.

**SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless

approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
