Bill Summary

The bill adds over-the-counter medications identified through the drug utilization review process to services provided under medicaid when the medications are prescribed by a licensed practitioner or a qualified licensed pharmacist. The medical services board is required to adopt rules to allow pharmacies to be reimbursed for dispensing the specified

SENATE Am ended 2nd Reading M arch 10, 2010 medications to medicaid recipients and to identify the standards for qualified pharmacists. Licensed pharmacists are required to consult with the recipient and, when appropriate, refer the recipient to appropriate health care professionals.

(2) (a) THE STATE BOARD, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE
 BOARD OF PHARMACY CREATED PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-22-103, C.R.S.,

16 (23.6) "Pharmaceutical care" means the provision of drug therapy 17 and other pharmaceutical patient care services by a pharmacist intended 18 to achieve outcomes related to the cure or prevention of a disease, 19 elimination or reduction of a patient's symptoms, or arresting or slowing 20 of a disease process. In addition to the preparation, dispensing, and 21 distribution of medications, "pharmaceutical care" may include 22 assessment and evaluation of the patient's medication related needs and 23 development and communication of a therapeutic plan with defined 24 outcomes in consultation with the patient and the patient's other health 25 care professionals to attain the desired outcome. This function includes 26 efforts to prevent, detect, and resolve medication related problems for 27 individual patients. "Pharmaceutical care" does not include prescriptive
