SECTION 2. Repeal. The appropriation to the department of public health and environment for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, as enacted in Section 18 (5) of chapter 421, Session Laws of Colorado 2010 (HB 10-1018), is repealed as follows:

Section 18. **Appropriation.** (5) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the innovative higher education research fund created in section 23-19.7-104 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of public health and environment, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, the sum of three hundred fourteen thousand eight hundred thirteen dollars (\$314,813), or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
