A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING SERVICES FOR PERSONS WITH DYSLEXIA IN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Each offender who is sentenced to the department of corrections is required to undergo a diagnostic examination and evaluation. The bill requires those diagnostic services to include screening for indicators of dyslexia. The bill requires the correctional education program to provide scientifically based or evidence-based reading instruction to offenders who may have dyslexia. The department of corrections is required to enter

into an agreement with a literacy consultant to assist the implementation of the dyslexia screening and educational programs.

The bill requires the department of human services to implement a dyslexia screening program for juveniles held in detention facilities and to administer scientifically based or evidence-based reading instruction to juveniles committed to the department who may have dyslexia. The department of human services is required to enter into an agreement with a literacy consultant to assist the implementation of the dyslexia screening and educational programs.

- 8 (3) NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), ON OR 9 BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2021, AND ON OR BEFORE EACH DECEMBER 1 10 THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES SHALL REPORT TO THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND 12 SENATE, OR ANY SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES, INFORMATION DESCRIBED IN 13 SECTION 17-32-204 (4) RELATING TO THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE 14 LITERACY CONSULTANT.

SECTION 7. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
