Bill Summary

Joint Technology Committee. The bill adds a provision to the procurement code that authorizes an applicable procurement official to select the most appropriate source selection method for a state procurement, even if a different source selection method is specified in statute. The new provision specifies that the procurement official has the

discretion, if that official determines that the source selection method specified in statute is not the most appropriate source selection method for the procurement, to determine and use a different source selection method in the best interest of the state, given time requirements, financial considerations, and market conditions.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-103-201, add (2) 3 as follows: 4 **24-103-201. Methods of source selection.** (2) IF A METHOD OF 5 SOURCE SELECTION IS SPECIFIED IN STATUTE AND THE APPLICABLE 6 PROCUREMENT OFFICIAL DETERMINES THAT THE SPECIFIED SOURCE 7 SELECTION METHOD IS NOT THE MOST APPROPRIATE SOURCE SELECTION 8 METHOD FOR THE PROCUREMENT, THE PROCUREMENT OFFICIAL HAS THE 9 DISCRETION TO DETERMINE AND USE A MORE APPROPRIATE SOURCE 10 SELECTION METHOD IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE STATE, GIVEN TIME 11 REQUIREMENTS, FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS, AND MARKET CONDITIONS. 12 THIS SUBSECTION (2) APPLIES TO ANY STATE PROCUREMENT THAT IS NOT 13 EXEMPT FROM THE CODE. 14 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 15 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 16 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 17 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 18 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 19 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 20 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 21 November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 22 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
