A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE PENALTY FOR CARELESS DRIVING RESULTING IN 102 DEATH.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill increases the number of points from 4 to 12 that accumulate on a person's driver's license as a result of a conviction for careless driving resulting in death.

2	SECTION 1. 42-2-127 (5), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
3	amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:
4	42-2-127. Authority to suspend license - to deny license - type
5	of conviction - points. (5) Point system schedule:
6	Type of conviction Points
7	(e.5) CARELESS DRIVING RESULTING IN DEATH
8	SECTION 2. 42-4-1402 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read:
10	42-4-1402. Careless driving - penalty. (2) (a) EXCEPT AS
11	OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPHS (b) AND (c) OF THIS SUBSECTION
12	(2), any person who violates any provision of this section commits a class
13	2 misdemeanor traffic offense. but,
14	(b) If the person's actions are the proximate cause of bodily injury
15	or death to another, such person commits a class 1 misdemeanor traffic
16	offense.
17	(c) If the person's actions are the proximate cause of
18	DEATH TO ANOTHER, SUCH PERSON COMMITS A CLASS 1 MISDEMEANOR
19	TRAFFIC OFFENSE.
20	SECTION 3. Specified effective date - applicability. This act
21	shall take effect upon passage and shall apply to offenses committed on
22	or after said date.
23	SECTION <u>4.</u> Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
24	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
25	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
