### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING AN INCREASE IN THE AMOUNT OF COMPENSATION TO 102 JURORS.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, trial and grand jurors are entitled to compensation up to \$50 per day. The bill increases the amount of compensation to up to a daily maximum of the state minimum wage plus \$1, times 8 hours.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 13-71-126 as
3	follows:
4	13-71-126. Compensation of employed jurors during first
5	three days of service - definition. (1) All regularly employed trial or
6	grand jurors shall MUST be paid regular wages, but not to exceed fifty
7	dollars the amount established in Subsection (2)(a) of this section
8	per day unless by mutual agreement between the employee and employer,
9	by their employers for the first three days of juror service, or any part
10	thereof. Regular employment shall include INCLUDES part-time,
11	temporary, and casual employment if the employment hours may be
12	determined by a schedule, custom, or practice established during the
13	three-month period preceding the juror's term of service.
14	(2) (a) THE WAGE FOR A REGULARLY EMPLOYED TRIAL OR GRAND
15	JUROR SHALL NOT EXCEED THE FOLLOWING:
16	$(\$1.00 + \text{THE STATE MINIMUM HOURLY WAGE}) \times 8.$
17	(b) As used in subsection (2)(a) of this section, "state
18	MINIMUM HOURLY WAGE" MEANS THE AMOUNT ESTABLISHED PURSUANT
19	TO SECTION 15 OF ARTICLE XVIII OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION, IN EFFECT
20	AT THE TIME OF THE JUROR SERVICE.
21	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 13-71-127 as
22	follows:
23	13-71-127. Financial hardship of employer or self-employed
24	juror. The court shall excuse an employer or a self-employed juror from
25	the duty of compensation for trial or grand juror service upon a finding
26	that it would cause financial hardship. When such a finding is made, a
27	juror shall receive reasonable compensation in lieu of wages from the

1	state for the first three days of juror service or any part thereof. Such
2	award shall not exceed fifty dollars THE AMOUNT ESTABLISHED IN SECTION
3	13-71-126 (2)(a) per day of juror service. A court hearing on an
4	employer's extreme financial hardship shall occur no later than thirty days
5	after the tender of the juror service acknowledgment information to the
6	employer. The request for a court hearing shall be made in writing to the
7	jury commissioner.
8	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 13-71-128 as
9	follows:
10	13-71-128. Reimbursement of unemployed jurors during first
11	three days of service. Each trial or grand juror who is unemployed may
12	apply to the jury commissioner on the first day of juror service and shall
13	MUST be reimbursed by the state for reasonable travel, child care, and
14	other necessary out-of-pocket expenses, except food, for the first three
15	days of juror service or any part thereof. The state court administrator
16	shall establish guidelines for the reimbursement of unemployed trial and
17	grand jurors. No award for an unemployed juror shall exceed fifty dollars
18	THE AMOUNT ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 13-71-126 (2)(a) per day of juror
19	service, and the court shall approve, prior to reimbursement, any award
20	which THAT is outside the guidelines. Any juror who is not regularly
21	employed, including, but not limited to, retired persons, homemakers,
22	students, unemployed persons, and persons receiving unemployment
23	benefits, shall be ARE entitled to reimbursement under this section. Juror
24	service shall MUST not cause a person to lose unemployment benefits.
25	<b>SECTION 4.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 13-71-129 as
26	follows:
27	13-71-129. Compensation of jurors after first three days of

The state shall pay each trial or grand juror who serves more than three days for the fourth day of service and each day thereafter at the rate of fifty dollars THE AMOUNT ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 13-71-126 (2)(a) per day. A trial or grand juror receiving payment under this section shall Is not be entitled to additional reimbursement for travel or other out-of-pocket expenses.

**SECTION 5.** Act subject to petition - effective date - applicability. (1) This act takes effect September 1, 2018; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

(2) This act applies to juror service on or after the applicable effective date of this act.
