A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING EXTENDING THE TRANSITIONAL JOBS PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Joint Budget Committee. The bill extends the time period to offer eligible individuals the opportunity to work in transitional jobs for 5 additional years.

The bill extends the repeal date of the transitional jobs program from July 1, 2025, to July 1, 2030.

20	26-2-1104. Repeal. This part 11 is repealed, effective July 1, 2025

22	SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
23	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
24	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
25	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
26	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
27	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
