A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER
EDUCATION FOR THE COLORADO OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP
INITIATIVE'S DISPLACED WORKERS GRANT.

Bill Summary

2	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly
3	finds that:
4	(a) Pursuant to the federal "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021",
5	Pub.L. 117-2, as the act may be subsequently amended, Colorado will
6	receive \$3,828,761,790 to be used for certain eligible uses. Federal
7	regulations providing guidance regarding eligible uses of money allocated
8	pursuant to the act include:
9	(I) Assistance to unemployed workers, including job training for
10	individuals who want and are available for work;
11	(II) Aid to impacted industries to respond to the negative
12	economic impacts of the COVID-19 public health emergency; and
13	(III) Programs, services, or other assistance for populations
14	disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency,
15	such as programs or services that address or mitigate the impacts of the
16	public health emergency on education;
17	(b) In 2020, the Colorado opportunity scholarship initiative
18	responded to needs caused by the COVID-19 pandemic by creating the
19	displaced workers grant. The displaced workers grant supports
20	Coloradans displaced by the COVID-19 pandemic, including those who
21	were laid off or furloughed, experienced decreased earnings, had job
22	offers rescinded, or were unable to enter the workforce because of
23	negative economic conditions. These workers have an incentive to reskill,
24	upskill, or complete industry-recognized credentials in order to improve
25	economic prospects for themselves and their communities.
26	(c) Appropriating a portion of the money received pursuant to the
27	federal "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021", Pub.L. 117-2, as the act

may be subsequently amended, to the Colorado opportunity scholarship initiative is estimated to serve at least three thousand displaced Colorado workers and will provide these workers with the skills, supports, and credentials necessary to secure good jobs, sustain a resilient state economy, and help institutions of higher education scale high-demand and highly impacted programs; and

- (d) These funds will be distributed to public institutions of higher education, community partners, and workforce centers across the state to provide scholarships, wraparound supports, and recruitment and retention efforts for Coloradans with some college education but no degree who have the need to reskill, upskill, or complete industry-recognized credentials due to lost or reduced employment.
- (2) The general assembly declares that appropriating a portion of the money received pursuant to the federal "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021", Pub.L. 117-2, as the act may be subsequently amended, to the Colorado opportunity scholarship initiative for such purposes described in this section are appropriate and lawful.

SECTION 2. Appropriation. (1) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, \$15,000,000 is appropriated to the department of higher education for use by the Colorado opportunity scholarship initiative advisory board. This appropriation is from the workers, employers, and workforce centers cash fund created in section 24-75-231 (2)(a), C.R.S., and from money the state received from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund. The Colorado opportunity scholarship initiative advisory board may use this appropriation for the Colorado opportunity scholarship initiative's displaced workers grant. Any money appropriated in this section not expended prior to July 1, 2021, is further appropriated to the Colorado
