2 (2) That the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the
3 House of Representatives remain in such capacity after adjournment of
4 the General Assembly *sine die* until the convening of the First Regular
5 Session of the Seventy-fifth General Assembly in January, 2025.

6 (3) That the President of the Senate and the Chair of the House
7 Services Committee, with the authorization of the Speaker of the House
8 of Representatives, are hereby separately authorized to retain and hire
9 replacements for such employees for such period of time in the interim
10 between the Second Regular Session of the Seventy-fourth General
11 Assembly and the First Regular Session of the Seventy-fifth General
12 Assembly as they deem necessary for their respective houses; except that
13 the office equipment of the General Assembly and the services of such
14 employees may be used only in connection with official legislative
15 business.

16 (4) That the President of the Senate and the Chair of the House
17 Services Committee, with the authorization of the Speaker of the House
18 of Representatives, are hereby separately authorized to hire such
19 session-only employees for the next regular session as they deem
20 necessary for their respective houses and who may start their employment
21 on the date authorized.
