**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE ADMINISTRATION OF EPINEPHRINE
BY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL AND
PROVISIONS RELATED TO ELECTIONS."**

1 Strike subsection (a) of section 7 in its entirety and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "(a) There shall be, in any municipality with a population of at least
4 one hundred forty thousand, an election monitor for the municipal
5 election in 2023 and the state election in 2024 to detect and prevent
6 irregularity and impropriety in the management of election
7 administration procedures and the conduct of said elections in such
8 municipality, provided, in any such municipality, no drop box may be
9 made available for the mailing of absentee ballots, by order of such
10 election monitor. The office of the Secretary of the State shall contract
11 with an individual to serve in such capacity as election monitor until
12 December 31, 2024, unless such contract is terminated for any reason by

13 the Secretary of the State prior to said date. Such election monitor shall:
14 (1) Not be considered a state employee; (2) be compensated in
15 accordance with such contract; and (3) be reimbursed for necessary
16 expenses incurred in the performance of his or her duties. Costs related
17 to the service of such election monitor shall be paid from moneys
18 appropriated to the Secretary for such purpose. Such municipality shall
19 provide for such election monitor any office space, supplies, equipment
20 and services necessary to properly carry out the duties and
21 responsibilities of the position. As used in this section, "population"
22 means the estimated number of people according to the most recent
23 version of the State Register and Manual prepared pursuant to section
24 3-90 of the general statutes."
