"AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE GLOBAL ENTREPRENEUR IN RESIDENCE PROGRAM."

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the 2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) (a) As used in this section:

(1) "Eligible institution" means (A) a public institution of higher
education within the state system of public higher education, as that
term is described in section 10a-1 of the general statutes, or (B) an
independent institution of higher education, as defined in section 10a173 of the general statutes;

9 (2) "Resident specialist" means any candidate for the program 10 described in subsection (b) of this section who (A) is employed in a 11 specialty occupation on a part-time basis by a private employer, (B) is 12 not a citizen of the United States, and (C) desires to move to or remain in the state in nonimmigrant status while employed by such privateemployer; and

(3) "Specialty occupation" has the same meaning as provided in 8
USC 1184(i), as amended from time to time.

17 (b) Not later than January 1, 2025, the Department of Economic and 18 Community Development shall submit recommendations, in 19 accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, 20 for the design and establishment of a three-year pilot program, which 21 shall be known as the Global Entrepreneur in Residence Program, to the 22 joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of 23 matters relating to commerce. The program shall be designed for the 24 purpose of retaining or attracting resident specialists in or to the state 25 and may:

(1) Facilitate or support partnerships between eligible institutions
and private employers that employ resident specialists for such
purpose;

29 (2) Assist resident specialists in filing visa applications; and

30 (3) Allow for the acceptance of donated funds in support of the31 program's purposes.

32 (c) In submitting recommendations pursuant to subsection (b) of this33 section, the Department of Economic and Community Development:

34 (1) Shall consult with The University of Connecticut, the Connecticut
35 State Colleges and Universities, the Office of Workforce Strategy and the
36 office of the Governor; and

37 (2) May consult with other eligible institutions, nonprofit
38 organizations and for-profit businesses, and include, but need not be
39 limited to, other programmatic recommendations to further the
40 program's purposes.

41 (d) Not later than January 1, 2025, the Department of Economic and

42	Community Development, The University of Connecticut and the
43	Connecticut State Colleges and Universities shall jointly conduct a
44	survey of noncitizen students at The University of Connecticut and the
45	Connecticut State Colleges and Universities, to assess potential interest
46	in the Global Entrepreneur in Residence Program. Such survey may be
47	conducted in collaboration with other eligible institutions and any other
48	parties."
