Explanation

The bill makes various changes regarding the regulation of prescription drugs resulting in the potential revenue gain described below.

Section 5 adds to the reasons for which the state Pharmacy Commission may take disciplinary action (which includes issuing a civil penalty of up to \$1,000) resulting in a potential revenue gain to the state to the extent violations occur and civil penalties are issued.

Section 7 creates an application and renewal fee for advanced pharmacy technicians and clerks of \$25 resulting in a potential revenue gain to the state to the extent these are applied for.

Section 11 establishes a task force to study the impact of unannounced retail pharmacy closures resulting in no fiscal impact because the task force has the expertise to meet the requirements of the bill.
