AN ACT PROHIBITING INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION FROM INQUIRING ABOUT A PROSPECTIVE STUDENT'S CRIMINAL HISTORY DURING THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2022*) Unless otherwise required by 2 an applicable state or federal law, no institution of higher education in 3 the state shall (1) inquire about a prospective student's prior arrests, 4 criminal charges or convictions (A) on an application for admission to 5 such institution, or (B) for enrollment in any program of study offered 6 by such institution, or (2) consider a student's prior arrests, criminal 7 charges or convictions in (A) the admissions process for such student, 8 or (B) determining the eligibility of such student for any form of 9 financial aid, grant or scholarship program, including, but not limited

10 to, institutional financial aid.

> This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Section 1 July 1, 2022 New section

Statement of Purpose:

To prohibit institutions of higher education from inquiring about a prospective student's criminal history during the admissions process.
