AN ACT REQUIRING THE ISSUANCE OF A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR A CAREER AND STEM COMPUTER OR MOBILE APPLICATION FOR STUDENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) Not later than October 1, 2022, the
2 Commissioner of Economic and Community Development, in
3 consultation with the Commissioner of Education, local and regional
4 boards of education and the Manufacturing Innovation Advisory Board,
5 established pursuant to section 32-7n of the general statutes, shall issue
6 a request for proposals for the development of a computer or mobile
7 application to promote student career awareness and STEM skill
8 development for middle school students in the state. Such application
9 shall be capable of providing analytics regarding student career
10 interests and student use of such application. Not later than January 1,
11 2023, the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development
12 shall report, in accordance with section 11-4a of the general statutes, to
13 the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having
14 cognizance of matters relating to education and commerce regarding the
15 results of the request for proposals.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
