Substitute Bill No. 6302

AN ACT STUDYING THE CONSOLIDATION OF PUBLIC SAFETY ANSWERING POINTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (Effective from passage) (a) Not later than September 1, 2021, 2 the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection, or the 3 commissioner's designee, shall convene a working group to (1) examine 4 the current system of public safety answering points in the state, (2) 5 develop a plan to consolidate public safety answering points that are 6 responsible for receiving and processing 9-1-1 calls for one municipality 7 and either serve a population of less than forty thousand, as determined 8 by the most recent population estimated by the Department of Public 9 Health, or receive and process less than twelve thousand 9-1-1 calls on 10 an annual basis, and (3) make recommendations for consolidating such 11 answering points while prioritizing the need to ensure public safety.

(b) The working group shall consist of the following members, who shall be appointed by the commissioner, or the commissioner's designee, not later than sixty days after the effective date of this section: Representatives from regional emergency telecommunications centers, multitown public safety answering points, public safety answering points, labor organizations representing employees of public safety answering points, and small and large municipalities, police chiefs and

- 20 Telecommunications within the Department of Emergency Services and
- 21 Public Protection, or the director's designee, and any other person
- invited by the commissioner to be a member of the working group.
 - (c) The commissioner shall submit, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to public safety and security: (1) An interim report on the findings, plan and recommendations of the working group not later February 1, 2022, and (2) a final report on the findings, plan and recommendations of the working group not later than January 1, 2023. The working group shall terminate on the date that the commissioner submits such final report or January 1, 2023, whichever is later.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
