AN ACT ESTABLISHING A COMMISSION ON HOMELESSNESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (Effective from passage) (a) There is established the
- 2 Commission on Homelessness within the Legislative Branch to review
- 3 existing and proposed housing policies and advise the General
- 4 Assembly on (1) strategies to prevent and reduce homelessness; (2) the
- 5 coordination of services for individuals and families experiencing
- 6 homelessness; (3) the provision of services and support, such as health
- 7 care, education and employment training for individuals and families
- 8 experiencing homelessness; (4) the provision of emergency shelter and
- 9 long-term housing solutions for individuals and families experiencing
- 10 homelessness; and (5) the availability and accessibility of affordable
- 11 housing in the state.
- 12 (b) The commission shall consist of the following members:
- 13 (1) One appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives,
- 14 who has expertise in homelessness policies and programs;
- 15 (2) One appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate, who

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16 has expertise in fair housing protections;

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- 17 (3) One appointed by the majority leader of the House of Representatives, who represents a homeless service provider;
- 19 (4) One appointed by the majority leader of the Senate, who 20 represents a low-income housing advocacy organization;
- 21 (5) One appointed by the minority leader of the House of 22 Representatives, who represents a landlord association;
- 23 (6) One appointed by the minority leader of the Senate, who 24 represents a faith-based organization that provides services to 25 individuals and families experiencing homelessness; and
- 26 (7) The Commissioner of Housing, or the commissioner's designee.
- (c) Any member of the commission appointed under subdivision (1),
 (2), (3), (4), (5) or (6) of subsection (b) of this section may be a member
 of the General Assembly.
 - (d) All initial appointments to the commission shall be made not later than sixty days after the effective date of this section. Appointed members of the commission shall serve for three-year terms which shall commence on the date of appointment and may serve until a successor is appointed. Any vacancy shall be filled by the respective appointing authority pursuant to subsection (b) of this section.
 - (e) The speaker of the House of Representatives and the president pro tempore of the Senate shall select the chairperson of the commission from among the members of the commission. Such chairperson shall schedule the first meeting of the commission, which shall be held not later than October 1, 2023.
 - (f) The commission shall have no authority over staffing or personnel matters. Any necessary staff shall be employed by the Joint Committee on Legislative Management, which shall have authority over the hiring, termination and performance review of any staff.

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- (g) The commission shall meet quarterly. Any appointed member who fails to attend three consecutive meetings or who fails to attend fifty per cent of all meetings held during any calendar year shall be deemed to have resigned from the commission.
 - (h) A majority of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business.

- (i) The members of the commission shall serve without compensation, but shall, within the limits of available funds, be reimbursed for expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of their duties.
- (j) The commission shall have the following powers and duties: (1) Obtain from any executive department, board, commission or other agency of the state such assistance and data as necessary and available to carry out the purposes in subsection (a) of this section; (2) accept any gift, donation or bequest for the purpose of performing the duties described in this section; (3) establish bylaws to govern its procedures; and (4) perform such other acts as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the duties described in subsection (a) of this section.
- (k) Not later than July 1, 2024, and annually thereafter, the commission shall submit a report on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to housing, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes.
- (l) The commission shall, subject to the provisions of chapter 67 of the general statutes, employ such employees as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this section. The commission may enter into such contractual agreements as may be necessary for the discharge of its duties, within the limits of its appropriated funds and in accordance with established procedures.

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This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
