AN ACT CONCERNING A PILOT PROGRAM REGARDING ADDICTION SERVICES EXPERTS AT POLICE DEPARTMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2023*) (a) The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection shall, within available appropriations, establish a pilot program to provide funding to law enforcement units, as defined in section 7-294a of the general statutes, to hire addiction services experts. The program shall provide such funding to units serving communities that are experiencing high drug overdose rates, as determined by the department.

8 (b) Each law enforcement unit that receives funding under the 9 program shall report to the department by July first of the year 10 following receipt of such funding on (1) how the unit has used the 11 funds, (2) how the use of addiction services experts impacted the unit's 12 work, and (3) whether the use of such experts impacted drug overdose 13 rates in the community served by the unit.

14 (c) Not later than January 1, 2024, and not later than January first 15 thereafter, if the department continues to provide funding to units under the program, the department shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, report the following information to the joint standing committee having cognizance of matters related to public safety: (1) The total amount of funds expended for the program, (2) the amounts provided to specific law enforcement units, and (3) a summary of the reports received by the department pursuant to subsection (b) of this section.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
