AN ACT ALLOWING TRAINED NURSE'S AIDES AND ASSISTED LIVING AIDES TO ADMINISTER MEDICATION TO NURSING HOME AND ASSISTED LIVING RESIDENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (Effective October 1, 2025) (a) As used in this section:
- 2 (1) "Administration" means the direct application of a medication by
- 3 means other than injection to the body of a person;
- 4 (2) "Assisted living aide" has the same meaning as provided in section
- 5 19-13-D105 of the regulations of Connecticut state agencies;
- 6 (3) "Assisted living services agency" has the same meaning as
- 7 provided in section 19a-490 of the general statutes;
- 8 (4) "Medication" means any medicinal preparation and includes any
- 9 controlled substances specifically designated in the regulations adopted
- 10 pursuant to subsection (d) of this section;
- 11 (5) "Nurse's aide" means a nurse's aide registered pursuant to chapter

12 378a of the general statutes;

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- (6) "Nursing home" has the same meaning as provided in section 19a 490 of the general statutes;
- 15 (7) "Registered nurse" means a registered nurse licensed pursuant to 16 chapter 378 of the general statutes;

- (8) "Trained assisted living aide" means an assisted living aide who has successfully completed training for the administration of medication pursuant to regulations adopted pursuant to subsection (d) of this section; and
- (9) "Trained nurse's aide" means a nurse's aide who has successfully completed training for the administration of medication pursuant to regulations adopted pursuant to subsection (d) of this section.
- (b) Notwithstanding any provision of chapter 378 of the general statutes: (1) A registered nurse employed by a nursing home may delegate the administration of medication to persons residing in such nursing home when such medication is administered by a trained nurse's aide employed by such nursing home; and (2) a registered nurse employed by an assisted living services agency may delegate the administration of medication to persons receiving services from such assisted living services agency when such medication is administered by a trained assisted living aide employed by such assisted living services agency.
- (c) Any nursing home or assisted living services agency that allows a registered nurse to delegate the administration of medication pursuant to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless any registered nurse that such nursing home or assisted living services agency allowed to delegate the administration of medication from financial loss and expense, including legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgment by reason of alleged negligence or other act resulting in personal injury, which acts are not wanton, reckless or malicious, and that occurred within the scope of such administration of medication.

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(d) The Commissioner of Public Health shall adopt regulations, in accordance with chapter 54 of the general statutes, to carry out the provisions of this section.

Sec. 2. Section 20-14i of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2025*):

Any provisions to the contrary notwithstanding, chapter 378 shall not prohibit the administration of medication to persons (1) attending day programs, residing in residential facilities or receiving individual and family support, under the jurisdiction of the Departments of Children and Families, Correction, Developmental Services and Mental Health and Addiction Services, (2) being detained in juvenile residential centers or residing in residential facilities dually licensed by the Department of Children and Families and the Department of Public Health, or (3) residing in substance abuse treatment facilities licensed by the Department of Children and Families pursuant to section 17a-145 when such medication is administered by trained persons, pursuant to the written order of a physician licensed under this chapter, a dentist licensed under chapter 379, an advanced practice registered nurse licensed to prescribe in accordance with section 20-94a or a physician assistant licensed to prescribe in accordance with section 20-12d, authorized to prescribe such medication. The provisions of this section shall not apply to institutions, facilities or programs licensed pursuant to chapter 368v, except as provided in section 1 of this act.
