AN ACT CONCERNING THE QUALIFICATIONS OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Section 3-124 of the general statutes is repealed and the
- 2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):
- 3 (a) There shall be an Attorney General to be elected in the same
- 4 manner as other state officers in accordance with the provisions of
- 5 section 9-181. The Attorney General shall (1) be an elector of this state,
- 6 [and an attorney at law of at least ten years' active practice at the bar of
- this state] (2) be a member in good standing of the bar of this state, and
- 8 (3) have engaged in the practice of law in this state for at least six
- 9 years.
- 10 (b) The office of the Attorney General shall be at the Capitol. On and
- 11 after January 4, 2023, the Attorney General shall receive an annual
- 12 salary equal to the annual salary of a judge of the Superior Court
- 13 under subsection (a) of section 51-47, provided thereafter, no increase
- 14 in the annual salary of the Attorney General shall take effect until the

- 15 first Wednesday following the first Monday of the January succeeding
- 16 the next election of the Attorney General following any increase in the
- annual salary of a judge of the Superior Court under section 51-47. The
- 18 Attorney General shall devote full time to the duties of the office and
- 19 shall give bond in the sum of ten thousand dollars.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following
