AN ACT CONCERNING EQUAL COST APPORTIONMENT FOR CERTAIN SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (Effective July 1, 2025, and applicable to assessment 2 years commencing on or after October 1, 2025) (a) Notwithstanding the 3 provisions of section 7-328 of the general statutes, any district 4 established pursuant to chapter 105 of the general statutes that contains 5 one hundred twenty or fewer lots may elect to apportion costs related 6 to the maintenance of any beach or private road located in the district, 7 or administrative costs associated with the management of the district, 8 to the owner or owners of each lot within the district on an equal basis, 9 provided (1) the board of directors of the district approves a resolution 10 proposing such method of apportionment, (2) said board calls a meeting 11 of the voters of the district, which meeting shall be held not later than 12 thirty days after said board's approval of the resolution, and (3) a 13 majority of the voters of the district in attendance at such meeting cast 14 votes in favor of such method of apportionment.

15 (b) The clerk of any district that elects to apportion costs pursuant to

16 this section shall notify the Secretary of the Office of Policy and

17 Management of such election not later than seven days after such18 election.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Statement of Purpose:

To allow certain special taxing districts to apportion costs for the maintenance of such district on an equal basis.
